To Sir, Rospine Maitland Lieut. Governor
of the Province of Upper Canada H. C. B. & Co.
In Council

We his Majesty's Subjects which have hereunto
set our hands, find ourselves under the necessity
of Petitioning to your Excellency concerning a report
from Peter Leving that a petition was prepared
by him concerning having a line and Establishment
made in front of what he calls his farm of Land in
front of the second concession, which said petition is
said to be forwarded to the Honourable Board of Assizes
which we think is too imminent to bear with, as the said
land which he petitions for will not be have there
land or other holds from the Old established town
which is the line in front of the third concession
which is made good and possible as far as his land
and estate, and for the best ground that can be
given that part for a town, therefore that cannot be
for any other persons cause. But can it be
possible that we are to be thus affected by one
individual, which have been too much the case for
his several years, but we your Excellency's petitioners
will be very thankful, should Government have any
kind of doubt about land in that part, to put it at the
point angle of the Town where the said boundaries
concerning or between the first and second concessions
where the concession line is not run, so that we
may enjoy the privilege of the land already worked,
