To Lieut. Gen. Sir John Leckburne
Governor of Upper Canada

Dear Sir
The Person who addresses you
has been in the Army the 9th Regt. of foot,
and left said Regt. in the year 1815 while stationed
at Kingston U.C. then under the command of
Sir John Cameron Lt. Col. Gen. Robinson com-
manded the Garrison some time who through
the strong recommendations of Sir John and the Officers
of the Regt. procured for me a lot of ground contain-
ing two hundred acres situated in the Township
of Bedford U.C. and likewise a situation in the
Revenue Department whereof Col. Hagerman was
chief, a short time after I rec^d. a letter from my
family in Ireland stating that a property which
belonged to my Father was immediately to be sold
agreeable to his Will and that my presence being living
would be required at that time being his eldest son
I accordingly made application to the General
stating the particulars and of my wish to come to
Ireland to receive my proportion of the purchase
money and return with the intent of improving my
lands at the same time I remarked that I might
meet with delays and begged he would obtain

Some length of time for my absence fearing
I might lose the lands, in the interim he accord-
ingly seeing the necessity of it, granted for one
an absence not to exceed twenty one years, seven-
teen of which, is nearly expired, I have been
married since my return to Ireland and my
children five in number are all young, year after
year I am endeavouring to arrange my affairs
which I think I shall have accomplished to two
years when I shall, I trust with your approbation
enjoy the grounds allotted to me by a parental Govern-
ment for my former services in Spain Portugal
France & America - I hold now the rank
Very Honoured General that you will pardon
me for troubling you with so long a subject
relying on your Honor's answer

to observe that my Father died shortly
after the Rebellion of 1798. from the severe
treatment he received from the rebels
during the time of the continuance - &c.
