I John Paton residing on South half of
lots No 20 and No 21, in the fourteenth Concession
in the Township of Belchenheim, do make and
ordain this my last will and testament, in manner
and form following, namely.

I give and
bequeath to my eldest Son John, lot No 20 and
to my other Son Robert lot No 21; it being
understood that if the one lot be considered better
than the other, the one who gets the best lot shall
be bound to make good the difference of value
to the other who gets the wrost; and it is understood
by this my will that if my Sons cannot agree
between themselves as to the relative difference of
value of said lots, they shall settle such by arbitration
each choosing a man for his interest.

I give and bequeath
to my two Sons John and Robert, the whole live stock
and moveables connected with the farm and house,
excepting the following, that I give my daughter Margaret
Paton or Little a cow, as also I give to my daughter Janet
Paton or Sellers a cow.

I hereby bind and oblige my two
Sons Conjunctly and severally to pay over after my decease,
to each of my two daughters, Agnes Paton and Mary Paton
the sum of Three hundred dollars. One hundred dollars
of said sum shall be paid to each of them at the end
of one year after my decease, and at the end of four years
from my decease they shall pay to each of them the sum
of Two hundred dollars. In witness whereof I do hereunto
set my hand and seal this Twenty fifth day of February the
Thousand and eight hundred and forty five years, in presence of the
