Province of Canada. Yeoman knowing the uncertainty
of life and being of sound and perfect mind. do hereby
Merrily bequeath unto you for the same do
make and publish this my last will and testament
in manner and form following. - Firstly I will
bequeath and devise of my beloved wife Jane
Pattullo her heirs and assigns for ever. the North
half of lot number thirteen in the fifth concession
of the Township of Wrentham Essex together with
all the hereditaments and appurtenances appertaining
thereto. - Secondly, I will bequeath and devise to
my son Alexander Pattullo his heirs and assigns
for ever. the North half of lot number fourteen
in the fifth concession of said Township of Wrentham
Essex subject nevertheless to the following proviso
that is to say that my said son Alexander shall
severally and respectively pay to each of my daughters
Jane Pattullo Margaret Pattullo Isabella Pattullo
Lucinda Foster Pattullo and Mary Pattullo the
sum of fifty pounds currency each. as my said daughters
shall respectively attain the age of twenty one years
and I further will and devise that in case my
said son Alexander shall either refuse or neglect

To pay unto each of my nine daughters the sum of
fifty pounds each as they respectively attain the age
of twenty one years. That my Executors hereafter
named or a Majority of them who may be surviving
shall sell and convey by deed or other proper and
sure instrument of conveyance, and I hereby authorize
and empower them ~~to do~~ the said North half
of lot number fourteen in the fifth concession of
the Township of Wilmamaspessie, and I hereby
will that the proceeds of such sale shall be
divided as follows. That is to say three two parts
of fifty pounds shall be paid to each of my
daughters above named and the residue of the
amount of sale to be paid in full to my
said son Alexander his heirs, Executors or
administrators. Thirdly I will and desire
that my Executors hereafter named shall bargain
sell and convey by deed or other necessary conveyance
(and I hereby empower and authorize them so to
do) the East half of lot number twenty nine
in the ninth concession of the Township of Esopus
and that the proceeds of such sale be divided
as follows. That is to say I will that the undivided
one third part of the proceeds of such sale
be paid to my son Thomas Nelson & heirs and
that the remaining two thirds be evenly and

divided amongst my Sons William Patten
George Robson Patten and Andrew Patten
It is my will and desire that the sale of the same
in Execution shall be made within one year after
my decease provided I shall decease before my
son Thomas shall attain the age of twenty one
years. Lastly I will and bequeath to my beloved
wife Jane Patten all the rest residue and
remainders of my estate either real or personal
of any nature or kind save.

And I hereby constitute and appoint my

Mountain both of the Township Chinguaicomy
Executors of this my last will and testament
hereby revoking all former wills by me made
