Authority Your Petitioner was located on
lot number Nineteen in the Eighth Con-
-cession / Eastern Division / of the aforesaid
Township of Oxford, on which lot Your

has made large Improvements thereon;

Your Petitioner therefore humbly prays
of Your Excellency that you will be pleased
to grant him the aforesaid lot, under the
Regulations of the 5th January 1796, acted

Caleb Piper.

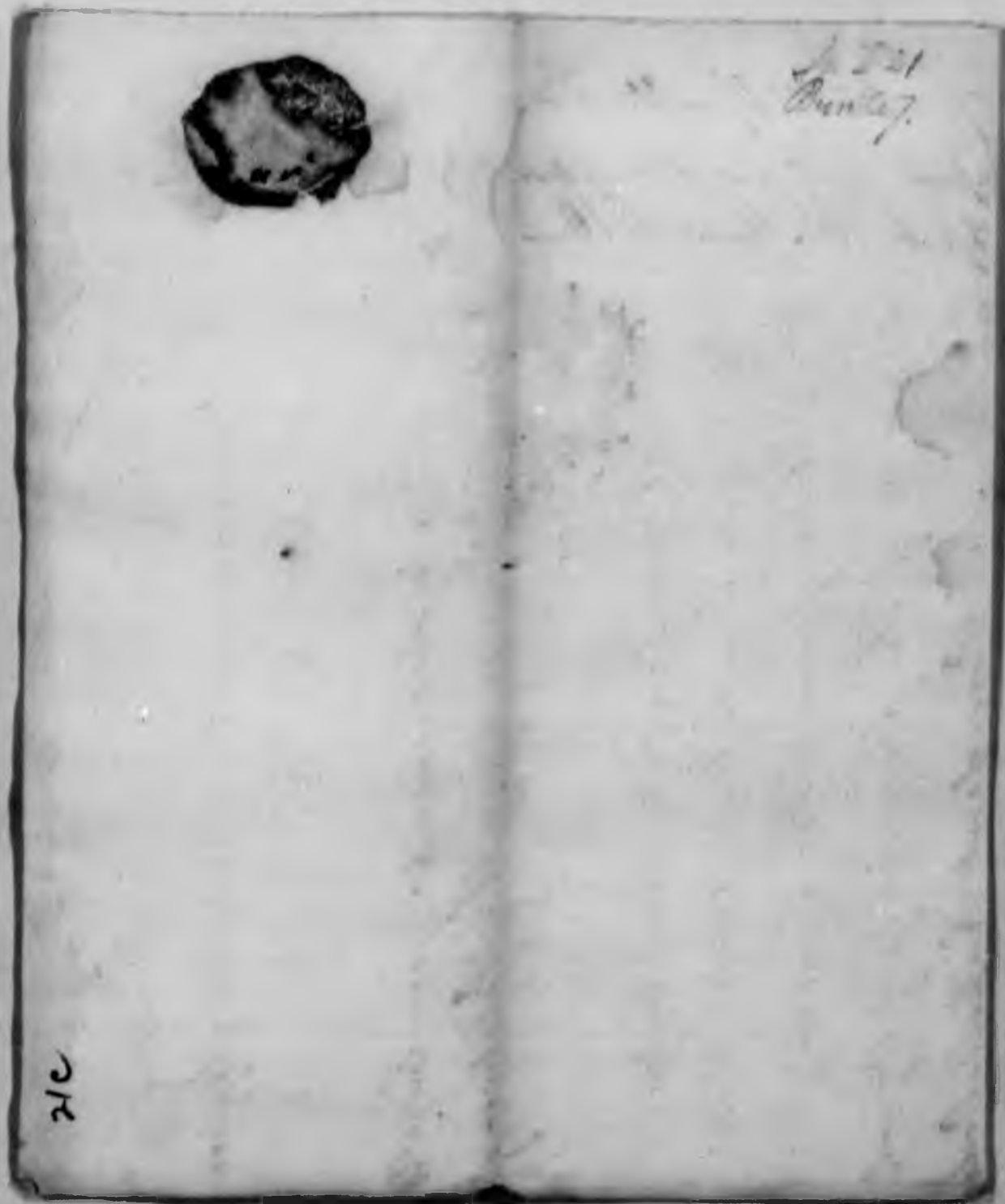
We are to state, that Caleb
Piper, was located on Lot No^o 19 in
the 8th Concession of the Eastern
division of the Township of Oxford,
under Mr^r President Russell's Order
of Appropriation, [or Conditional Loca-
tion] of the 1st August 1797. - for
twelve Months only.

It does not however appear,
that Caleb Piper has since taken
any steps, to secure himself in a
Grant, of the aforesaid conditional
Location.
