of my personal property after paying all just demands
I also bequeath to the said anna maria my beloved
wife the entire exclusive and undivided use of my
dwelling house situated in the village of tillsonburgh
where I now reside to have and to hold the same
as long as she the said anna remains my widow
if she should get married to another husband
then the proceeds of said dwelling house and
lot to go for the support of my children herein
after named I give my real estate which I
shall be leaved and possessed on to which I shall
be entitled at the time of my decease to my three
children William henry Jacob, mary eira and
anna maria each one to get an equal share
either by selling the estate or otherwise as they
can best agree when the youngest my attain
to the age of twenty one years

to have and to hold the same to them and
their heirs executors administrators and assigns
to them and their use and behoof for ever
And I do nominate and appoint my
Worthey friend Joseph Matthias Sanders
and Robert Brown to be the executors
of this my last Will and testament
in testimony whereof I the said
