The Petition of James Reynolds
late Captain in the 4th W^{est} Regiment in the service
of His Britannic Majesty -

Sheweth that your Petitioner
on the 14th November last addressed a Petition
to your Excellency, praying that he might receive
his Location on certain ungranted Lots, in the
Townships of West Oxford & Berford, which
Petition was on the 23^d same month, submitted
to the Executive Council for their consideration
and Report, the Council recommended that,
your Petitioner should be located as prayed
for subject to the usual conditions - and which
recommendation was approved of by your Excellency;

The Gazette of the 4th February, having
come under the notice of your Petitioner, he observed
that the principal & by far the most valuable Lot
of those prayed for, viz. Lot 2, 2^d Concession, W. Oxford
had already been advertised on the 7th Sept^r previous
to your Petitioner's Application - on addressing
a communication to Mr. Peirce, Clerk of the
Council - Petitioner received in reply, Minutes
of Council dated 1st Sept^r 1836 and 5th January
1837

by which it appeared that the Lot in Question
had been already disposed of to James Wolf Whiting
in the name of his Father Charles Whiting
provided (as it appears) that the heirs of the
Original Locatee, did not make good their
Claims in July 1837 - before the heir & devisee
Commission -

Under these circumstances, your
Petitioner having discovered that Lot No. 1 in
the 3^d Concessions, East. Oxford, is a forfeited Lot
for which no deed has been issued - & which Petitioner
believes sits on No. 2, 2^d Con. W. Oxford - prays
that your Excellency, will be pleased graciously
to direct that Petitioner may be located on
said Lot, in part of his Location, according
to His Majesty's Regulations, & your Petitioner
shall pray - &c -

Bushville West Byford
May 10th 1837

On the 21st March I forwarded a
Petition to His Excellency the Lieut. Governor praying
that I might be allowed to locate Lot 1. 3rd Concession
East Byford. The Lots I applied for on a former
Occasion having been claimed by the Original Locators
not having a title at that time &c. - except of the
Township of B. & W. Byford. I was led into an Error
the Lot I applied for should have been Lot 1. 3rd (on
West Byford) stated to be a forfeited Lot. May I beg
Sir you will be good enough to submit this matter
to His Excellency that the Error may be corrected
and should this be considered inadvisable as
imposing too much on the time and Attention of
the Executive Council, then I request that His
Excellency will be pleased to direct that I may receive
my Location tickets for certain Lots in the Township
of Brasher dated May 1835 - and which the late
Lieut. Governor allowed to be reserved for me -
