the same be situate to have the same
unto the said John Wilson and Rodwell Matheson
their heirs and assigns to the use upon and
for the trusts and purposes, and with, under
and subject to the powers, provisions and
agreements hereinafter expressed and contained
of and concerning the same. I do give and
bequeath all my personal estate whosoever
and whatsoever, of what nature kind and
quality soever the same may be unto the said
John Wilson and Rodwell Matheson their
executors, administrators and assigns upon
and for the trusts intents and purposes
hereinafter declared and expressed of and
concerning the same. And I do hereby declare
my will and mind to be that my said real
and personal estate hereinafter devised and

respectively as aforesaid are to devise and
bequeathed upon the trusts, intents and
purposes and with, under and subject
