W. G. Howland dated 9th April 1851 from which it appears
that it contains five Acres one rood & four ten perches. Also
an Affidavit made 1st Sept. 1837 by W. Howland & Thomas
Holcroft in which they state that there is no improvement
thereon and that the Applicant is the owner of the adjoining
Lot No. 25 in the same Concession. W. Howland values the
piece of land applied for at fifteen shillings per Acre

The small broken lot applied for is disposable Crown Land
and as the Petitioner seems to be the owner of the adjoining lot
there appears to be no objection to a sale being made to him under
the sanction of the 25th Section of the Act 4th & 5th Victoria Ch. 100.

But as Deputy Surveyor Peter Carroll who in the year 1842
inspected the Township valued lands slightly situated

thereon at twenty five shillings per Acre. It is suggested
that a sale at that rate be authorized. As at a lower
