That a Ticket of Location issued from  
the Surveyor General's Office by Order of Your Excellency  
in Council dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of May 1820, for Lot Number  
Twenty Six in the Twelfth Concession of the Township of  
Zorra in the County of Oxford in the District of London  
Containing Two hundred Acres subject to the settling duties  
required by the Order in Council of the 20<sup>th</sup> of October 1818.

That the said Daniel Shancholtz was for a long  
time confined to his bed by sickness and is since dead,  
and was not able to perform the settling duty required by the  
said Order in Council in his life time, and that he the  
said Daniel Shancholtz at his decease left three Children  
Two Daughters and a Son under Eleven Years Old and  
leaving but a very little property for his Family.

That Your Excellency will be graciously pleased to extend  
the farther utmost period of time for performance of said  
settlement duty on the lot aforesaid.
