



KEN WAS BORN IN INGERSOLL AND LIVED HERE FOR MOST OF HIS SCHOOLING. HE WAS AN OUTSTANDING DIVER AND RECEIVED HIS EARLY TRAINING AT THE TATHAM POOL IN WOODSTOCK.

KEN WAS A MEMBER OF THE CANADIAN COMMON WEALTH GAMES TEAM AT NEW ZEALAND IN 1974 AND AT EDMONTON IN 1978, WHERE HE WON A SILVER MEDAL. IN 1976, HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE CANADIAN OLYMPIC TEAM AT MONTREAL. HE WAS SELECTED FOR THE 1980 OLYMPIC CANADIAN TEAM FOR MOSCOW - BUT, THE CANADIAN GOVERNMENT AND OLYMPIC COMMITTEE BOYCOTTED THE MOSCOW GAMES. HE LATER WENT ON TO TEACH AND COACH DIVING IN CALGARY.



Buck Billings


"BUCK" WAS BORN IN MOOSE JAW, BUT HE LATER MOVED TO TORONTO. HE PLAYED FOR THE BALMY BEACH FOOTBALL TEAM, WINNING THE CANADIAN SENIOR FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP. "BUCK" WAS AN ALL ROUND ATHLETE AND WAS ALSO A STAR IN TRACK & FIELD.

HE MOVED TO INGERSOLL IN 1945, WORKING AND INSTRUCTING AT THE "Y". WHEN THE MAUDE WILSON SWIMMING POOL WAS OPENED, HE BECAME THE MANAGER AND CHIEF INSTRUCTOR FOR 25 YEARS.

IT HAS BEEN ESTIMATED THAT "BUCK" TAUGHT 5000 INGERSOLL AND DISTRICT YOUNGSTERS TO SWIM.

HE WAS ALSO THE MANAGER OF THE CHARLES ST. ARENA FOR TWO YEARS. "BUCK" IS NOW RETIRED AND IS RESIDING AT THE WOODINGFORD LODGE IN WOODSTOCK.




HE WAS BORN ON SEPTEMBER 23, 1943 IN INGERSOLL AND HAS RESIDED IN INGERSOLL ALL'HIS LIFE.

HE STARTED RECREATIONAL SKATING AT I.D.M.C. AT THE AGE OF 16. HE STARTED COMPETATIVE SPEED SKATING FOR SKATELAND ARENA, MOUNT MORRIS MICHIGAN IN 1966 AT THE AGE OF 23.

HE WON THE MICHIGAN SPEED DERBY NOVICE MEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP IN 1966-1967, THE MICHIGAN STATE CHAMIPONSHIP IN 1967 AND THE ONTARIO SENIOR MEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP IN 1970.

GARY PLAYED BASEBALL, BASKETBALL AND FOOTBALL AND PRESENTLY IS STILL ACTIVE IN SOFTBALL, HOCKEY AND GOLF.



Red Clarke


HE WAS A BUSINESSMAN IN INGERSOLL, WHO SPONSORED AND MANAGED THE INGERSOLL REEMS JUNIOR "C", HOCKEY TEAM.

DURING THE YEARS 1952 TO 1954, THE REEMS WENT TO THE ONTARIO HOCKEY ASSOCIATION FINAL. THEY LOST TWICE TO COLLINGWOOD AND ONCE TO MIDLAND.

IN THE SEASON OF 1954-1955, "RED" COACHED THE TEAM HIMSELF AND INGERSOLL WON BOTH THEIR DIVISION AND THE ONTARIO HOCKEY ASSOCIATION JUNIOR "C" CHAMIPIONSHIP, DEFEATING COLLINGWOOD IN FOUR STRAIGHT GAMES.

THIS HAS BEEN THE ONLY ONTARIO HOCKEY ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIP INGERSOLL HAS EVER WON.

Len Coles

HE WAS BORN IN WOODSTOCK, BUT HE MOVED TO INGERSOLL IN THE YEAR 1940. HE WAS AN ALL ROUND ATHLETE INVOLVED WITH BASEBALL, FOOTBALL, SOFTBALL, SOCCER, BASKETBALL, TENNIS, TRACK & FIELD, AND BADMINTON. WHILE ATTENDING THE UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO, HE ROWED ON THE VARSITY ROWING TEAM.

IN 1936, WITH JACK SIBBALD (ALSO OF WOODSTOCK) AS HIS DOUBLES PARTNER, HE WON THE CANADIAN BADMINTON DOUBLES CHAMPIONSHIP IN OTTAWA.

IN 1946, LEN ENDED HIS SPORTS CAREER PITCHING SOFTBALL FOR P.T. WALKER'S FRIGIDAIRES OF THE INGERSOLL & DISTRICT SOFTBALL LEAGUE.

DURING HIS YOUTH, GARNET WON MANY LONG DISTANCE RUNNING EVENTS. HE WAS A GREAT PROMOTER OF KIDS SPORTS. HE ALWAYS HAD A RINK ON HIS PROPERTY, AT KING HIRAM ST., AND EACH WINTER HE ORGANIZED THE "STUMPTOWN CARNIVAL" WITH RACES AND SKATING FOR ALL KIDS AND ADULTS.

FOR MANY YEARS, HE WAS THE CARETAKER AND GROUNDS KEEPER OF THE SOFTBALL DIAMOND AT THE QUEEN ELIZABETH SCHOOL.

THE GARNET ELLIOTT PARK, USED FOR SOFTBALL AND SOCCER ON THE NORTH SIDE OF INGERSOLL, IS NAMED IN HIS MEMORY.

LES WAS BORN IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA. HE PLAYED PROFESSIONAL SOCCER IN HIS NATIVE LAND, THEN IMMIGRATED TO CANADA AFTER WORLD WAR II TO A FARM SOUTH OF INGERSOLL.

IN 1959, HE ORGANIZED INTERMEDIATE "B" HOCKEY AND LATER INTERMEDIATE "A". HE BROUGHT JUNIOR "B" HOCKEY TO INGERSOLL AND IN LATER YEARS JUNIOR "C". HE SERVED AS MANAGER ON THE ABOVE CLUBS AND CONTRIBUTED TO OTHER SPORTS AS WELL AS HOCKEY.

George Hayes

HE WAS BORN IN MONTREAL AND MOVED WITH HIS FAMILY TO INGERSOLL WHEN HE WAS 8 YEARS OLD.

SPORTS HAS BEEN HIS LIFE WHILE PLAYING BASEBALL FOR INGERSOLL, TILLSONBURG, WOODSTOCK AND STRATFORD.

HE PLAYED HOCKEY FOR INGERSOLL, WOODSTOCK AND BEACHVILLE AND ALSO PLAYED FOOTBALL FOR WOODSTOCK.

GEORGE STARTED REFEREEING IN HIS TEENS. HIS FIRST GAME WAS BETWEEN INGERSOLL COLLEGIATE AND LONDON CENTRAL COLLEGIATE.



TOUR OF EUROPE IN 1959 WITH NEW YORK RANGERS AND BOSTON BRUINS - 23 GAMES.

HE WAS FIRST N.H.L. OFFICIAL TO WORK (1000) ONE THOUSAND GAMES. GEORGE WORKED A TOTAL OF 2665 GAMES IN HIS 30 YEAR CAREER.

HE WAS SUSPENDED BY N.H.L. PRESIDENT <u>CLARENCE</u> <u>CAMPBELL</u> ON FEBRUARY 1, 1965 FOR REFUSING AN EYE TEST.



HE WAS BORN IN REBECCA, ONTARIO. FROM 1928-1930 HE PITCHED FOR INGERSOLL WHERE HE PITCHED A NO-HITTER IN INTER COUNTY LEAGUE FINALS AGAINST GALT IN 1929.

1930 - INGERSOLL WON THE ONTARIO BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP WITH "LEFTY" WINNING 26 GAMES WITHOUT A LOSS.

1931-33 - DURING THESE YEARS HE PITCHED FOR GUELPH. IN 1932 THEY WON THE SENIOR O.B.A. CHAMPIONSHIP WHERE HE SET AN O.B.A. STRIKE OUT RECORD THAT STILL STANDS.

- 1933 HE TURNED PROFESSIONAL WITH THE CHICAGO CUBS IN THE FALL.
- 1934 HE PLAYED MINOR LEAGUE PRO BASEBALL WITH LOS ANGELES AND PEORIA BEFORE BEING SOLD TO THE ST. LOUIS CARDINALS WHERE HE PLAYED FOR SPRINGFIELD MO., COLUMBUS GA., COLUMBUS OHIO, LOUISVILLE, GREENWOOD, PERTH, ROCHESTER, DECATUR AND SACRAMENTO.
- 1941 "LEFTY" WAS DRAFTED BY THE BOSTON RED SOX WHERE HE Played until 1945.
- 1943 HE WAS PICKED FOR THE AMERICAN LEAGUE ALL STAR TEAM WHICH MADE HIM THE FIRST CANADIAN TO BE SELECTED FOR THIS HONOUR.
- 1945 BOSTON SOLD HIM TO THE PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES WHERE HE CONTINUED TO PITCH, PLAY SOME FIRST BASE AND LEFT FIELD, AND INDULGE IN SOME VERY SUCCESSFUL PINCH HITTING.
- 1948 HE FINISHED HIS CAREER WITH TORONTO OF THE INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE WHERE HE HAD A NO-HITTER AGAINST SYRACUSE.
- 1969 HE WAS VOTED THE BEST LEFT HANDED PITCHER TO COME FROM CANADA.
- 1986 "LEFTY" WAS NAMED TO THE CANADIAN BASEBALL HALL OF FAME IN TORONTO.



Charlie Kelly

CHARLIE WAS AN OUTSTANDING FASTBALL PITCHER AND HARD HITTER. HE, ALONG WITH CATCHER BOB HENDERSON WERE THE OUTSTANDING BATTERY IN MANY DISTRICT TOURNAMENTS IN THE 1920'S.

WHILE WITH THE CANADIAN ARMY OVERSEAS IN 1917, HE PITCHED AGAINST AN ALL-STAR U.S.A. TEAM IN LONDON, ENGLAND; WINNING 2-1. CHARLIE PITCHED AGAINST HERB PENNOCK, A STAR IN THE MAJOR BASEBALL LEAGUE.

KING GEORGE WAS A SPECTATOR AND CONGRATULATED KELLY WITH A HAND SHAKE FOR HIS 2-1 VICTORY.

CHARLIE PLAYED BASEBALL IN INGERSOLL, AFTER THE FIRST WORLD WAR UNTIL 1927. HIS CAREER WAS ENDED BY ILLNESS.

HE DIED IN 1933.



Marlene Walters Kirwin

SHE WAS BORN IN INGERSOLL IN 1946 WHERE SHE SPENT HER EARLY YEARS AND RECEIVED HER EDUCATION.

5 PIN BOWLING WAS ORGANIZED IN INGERSOLL IN 1957. AT THIS TIME, MARLENE, AT AGE 11, JOINED THE LEAGUE AND LEARNED HOW TO BOWL WHERE SHE PARTICIPATED IN LOCAL TOURNAMENTS.

IN 1960, AT 14 YEARS OF AGE, SHE WON THE ONTARIO BANTAM SINGLES 5 PIN BOWLING CHAMPIONSHIP AND LATER THE DOMINION 5 PIN BOWLING CHAMPION-SHIP WHERE SHE HAD TO OVERCOME SOME 1600 COMPETITORS.

MARLENE RESIDES ON A BEEF FARM IN MT. ELGIN WITH HER HUSBAND MIKE AND FOUR CHILDREN. SHE HAS RECENTLY RETURNED TO BOWLING, BUT ONLY AS A HOBBY. ANOTHER HOBBY INCLUDES THE FAMILIES TWO RIDING HORSES.



Roy "Goose" Land

HE WAS BORN IN INGERSOLL IN JANUARY OF 1933.

HE STARTED PLAYING MINOR HOCKEY UP THROUGH THE INGERSOLL MINOR HOCKEY SYSTEM IN THE EARLY 1940'S AND PLAYED JUNIOR HOCKEY HERE FROM 1948 TO 1953.

"GOOSE" ATTENDED NEW YORK RANGERS ROOKIE CAMP AT SARENACK LAKE, NEW YORK STATE IN 1950 AND WAS SENT TO THE JUNIOR "A" CLUB, GUELPH BILTMORES. SOME OF HIS TEAM MATES WERE; HARRY HOWELL, ANDY BATHGATE, RON MURPHY, DEAN PRENTICE, AND LOU FONTINATO.

HE CHOSE TO RETURN TO INGERSOLL, PLAYING JUNIOR UNTIL 1953, WITH THE INGERSOLL REEMS.


IN 1955 "GOOSE" PLAYED FOR THE TILLSONBURG MAROONS INTERMEDIATE "A" HOCKEY CLUB, THAT WON THE ONTARIO HOCKEY ASSOCIATION INTERMEDIATE "A" CHAMPIONSHIP.

HE PLAYED INTERMEDIATE HOCKEY FOR INGERSOLL FROM 1959-1963.

IN 1964, HE PLAYED FOR THE WOODSTOCK SENIORS - WHO WON THE SENIOR O.H.A. CHAMPIONSHIP BEFORE LOSING IN THE ALLAN CUP FINALS TO THE WINNIPEG MAROONS, IN WINNIPEG.

HE ALSO PLAYED AND COACHED INTERMEDIATE "B" HOCKEY IN INGERSOLL IN THE 1970'S AND COACHED DORCHESTER TO THE O.H.A. INTERMEDIATE B CHAMPIONSHIPS 1979-1980 AND 1980-1981.

GOOSE HAS ALSO PLAYED MANY YEARS OF BASEBALL AND SOFTBALL IN INGERSOLL.






HE WAS THE BEST BOXER DURING THE 1920'S AND 30'S TO COME FROM INGERSOLL. AT THIS TIME, BOXING WAS A GREAT AND POPULAR SPORT.

HE BOXED AS A WELTER WEIGHT IN 60 BOUTS, WINNING 50 AND NEVER BEING KNOCKED OUT.

IN 1936, HE FOUGHT IN THE CANADIAN OLYMPIC TRIALS IN MONTREAL. HE KNOCKED OUT BILLY POLLARD OF EDMONTON IN THE 2ND ROUND, THEN LOST TO GORDON SCHMALZ OF KITCHENER IN A SPLIT DECISION.

IN 1939, GEORGE JOINED THE CANADIAN ARMY AND WON THE ARMY ALDERSHOT COMMAND CHAMPIONSHIP WHILE SERVING OVERSEAS.

GEORGE ALWAYS WAS A DEDICATED BOXER IN EXCELLENT CONDITION, WHO TRAINED A NUMBER OF INGERSOLL AND DISTRICT BOXERS IN A GYMNASIUM BESIDE HIS HOME.



Al Lockhart


AL WAS BORN IN INGERSOLL AND WAS A GOOD ALL AROUND ATHLETE. HE PLAYED FOOTBALL, HOCKEY, BASEBALL AND SOFTBALL.

IN 1963, HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE INGERSOLL MIDGET "B" ONTARIO BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM, AFTER BEING CALLED UP FROM THE BANTAMS IN THE PLAY-OFFS.

DURING 1968, AL WAS AN OUTSTANDING RUNNING BACK ON THE INGERSOLL DISTRICT COLLEGIATE FOOTBALL TEAM, THAT WON THE OXFORD - ELGIN SENIOR COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIP.

IN 1968 TO 1969, HE ALSO PLAYED WING FOR THE INGERSOLL MARLANDS JUNIOR HOCKEY TEAM. HE WON THE INTERCOUNTY LEAGUE SCORING TITLE.

IN 1972, AL, IN HIS FOURTH YEAR PLAYING FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN ONTARIO MUSTANGS, HELPED THEM TO THE CANADIAN INTERCOLLEGIATE SENIOR FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP, DEFEATING ALBERTA UNIVERSITY GOLDEN BEARS TO WIN THE VANIER CUP.



Lorne Moon

HE WAS BORN IN INGERSOLL WHERE HE RESIDED ALL HIS LIFE EXCEPT FOR $3\frac{1}{2}$ years of naval service.

A MAJOR PART OF HIS LIFE WAS SPENT IN MINOR SPORTS WHERE HE SERVED AS PRESIDENT, MANAGER AND COACH OF MINOR BASEBALL FOR 14 YEARS.

ALSO, HE ORGANIZED MINOR BOWLING WHERE HE SERVED AS PRESIDENT AND COACH FOR 5 YEARS.


HE SERVED AS MANAGER AND COACH OF MINOR HOCKEY FOR 20 YEARS AS WELL AS BEING THE TIME KEEPER AND P.A. ANNOUNCER FOR 14 OF THOSE YEARS.

FROM 1959 - 1974 HE WAS AN EXECUTIVE MEMBER OF THE INTER-MEDIATE A, INTERMEDIATE B, JUNIOR B AND JUNIOR C HOCKEY TEAMS.

HE WAS ALSO THE SPORTS REPRESENTATIVE ON THE RECREATION BOARD, PARKS BOARD AND ARENA BOARD.

WITH LORNE'S DEDICATION TO INGERSOLL MINOR SPORTS, A BROAD BASE WAS CREATED FROM WHICH FUTURE YEARS OF MINOR SPORTS WOULD PROSPER.

HE WAS ELECTED TO THE SPORTS HALL OF FAME IN INGERSOLL IN 1986.



"Had" Petríe "Sr"

"HAD" WAS KNOWN AS THE "FATHER OF SOFTBALL" IN INGERSOLL. HE ORGANIZED THE FIRST MEN'S SOFTBALL TEAM, CALLED THE "ORIOLES" IN THE EARLY 1920'S. DURING THE LATE 20'S HE FORMED THE FIRST GIRL'S SOFTBALL TEAM.

HE MANAGED THE MORROW CO. SOFTBALL TEAM IN THE TOWN INDUSTRIAL LEAGUE FOR MANY YEARS.

BESIDES BEING INTERESTED IN HOCKEY, BASEBALL AND SOFTBALL, "HAD" WAS THE LEADER OF THE "STUMPTOWN BAND", THAT PLAYED AT THE ARENA FOR SKATING AND SPORTING EVENTS.

Dolph Staples

"MR. BASEBALL", AS HE WAS KNOWN IN INGERSOLL DURING THE 1920'S AND 1930'S, FIRST ENTERED A TEAM IN THE ONTARIO BASEBALL ASSOCIATION IN 1924, IN THE OXFORD - ELGIN LEAGUE. THEY WON THE GROUP CHAMPIONSHIP THAT YEAR AND ALSO IN 1925 AND 1926, BUT LOST OUT IN THE ONTARIO BASEBALL ASSOCI-ATION PLAYDOWNS.


IN 1927, HIS TEAM WON THE WESTERN ONTARIO ASSOCIATION, BUT LOST TO LEAMINGTON IN ONTARIO BASEBALL ASSOCIATION SEMI FINALS.

IN BOTH 1928 AND 1929, THE TEAM PLAYED WINNING BALL, BOWING OUT IN THE PLAYDOWNS.

IN 1930, DOLPH HIT PAY DIRT, WINNING THE BASEBALL ASSOCIATION INTERMEDIATE ALL ONTARIO CHAMPIONSHIP WITH HIS GREATEST TEAM. AFTER WINNING THE INTERCOUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP, THE TEAM BEAT BRANTFORD, SARNIA, DUNDAS, HARROW AND PETERBOROUGH ON THEIR WAY TO THIS TITLE. THEY WON 44 GAMES AND LOST ONLY 3.

DOLPH ALSO MANAGED THE INGERSOLL TEAM THAT BECAME ONTARIO BASEBALL CHAMPIONS IN 1937, BEFORE TAKING ILL.

MR. STAPLES DIED IN 1940.


HE WAS ONE OF INGERSOLL'S LEADING SPORTSMEN AND BUILDERS. IN 1923, HE COACHED THE INGERSOLL JUNIOR HOCKEY TEAM.

DURING THE YEARS OF 1924 TO 1931, HE WAS AN EXECUTIVE MEMBER OF INGERSOLL BASEBALL TEAMS; INCLUDING THE 1930 ONTARIO BASEBALL ASSOCI-ATION CHAMPIONS.

HE WAS ALSO ONE OF THE ORIGINAL MEMBER/DIRECTORS WHO BOUGHT THE PROPERTY AND FOUNDED THE INGERSOLL GOLF CLUB.

HE WAS THE FIRST CHAIRMAN OF THE INGERSOLL MEMORIAL CENTRE WHICH OPENED IN 1959.

INDUCTED IN 1986 - BUILDER



Elizabeth (Betty) Taylor brough fame to her country and to this community in the 1936 summer Olympics in Los Angeles when she placed third in the women's 80 metre hurdle event.

SHE WAS BORN IN INGERSOLL ON FEBRUARY 22, 1916, BUT MOVED TO HAMILTON, ONTARIO IN THE LATE 1920'S TO JOIN THE HAMILTON ATHLETIC CLUB.

WHEN SHE WAS ONLY 14 YEARS OLD, SHE WON THE CANADIAN 80 METRE HURDLES. IN 1932, SHE WAS A MEMBER OF THE CANADIAN OLYMPIC TEAM, AT LOS ANGELES.

IN 1934, SHE WAS A MEMBER OF THE BRITISH EMPIRE TRACK AND FIELD TEAM. AT BERLIN, GERMANY IN 1936, AS A MEMBER OF THE CANADIAN OLYMPIC TEAM, SHE WON THE BRONZE MEDAL IN THE 80 METRE HURDLES. IN 1936, BETTY WAS VOTED CANADIAN WOMAN ATHLETE OF THE YEAR.

IN 1961, INGERSOLL WON THE ONTARIO BANTAM "B" BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP, DEFEATING GANANOGOE IN THE FINALS.

IN 1963, INGERSOLL WON THE ONTARIO MIDGET "B" BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP. DEFEATING AJAX IN THE FINALS.

IN 1964, INGERSOLL WON THE ONTARIO JUNIOR "B" BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP, DEFEATING DUNNVILLE IN THE FINALS.

RON COACHED SIX PLAYERS, WHO LIKE HIM, WERE ON ALL THREE CHAMPIONSHIP TEAMS. NAMELY; LORNE BRADY, PAUL HENDERSON, HUGH PONTING, BOB NADALIN, DAVE VANKOUGHNETT, AND "RED" MACDONALD.


HE RACED HYDROPLANES WITH LORNA REID, WHO HE EVENTUALLY MARRIED.

- 1934: HE WON THE WORLD RACING TITLE WHICH TOOK PLACE AT THE CANADIAN NATIONAL EXHIBITION AT THE TORONTO WATERFRONT DRIVING HIS 225 CUBIC INCH CLASS HYDROPLANE, "LITTLE MISS CANADA III."
- 1935: HE WON HIS SECOND WORLD TITLE IN THE SAME 225 CUBIC INCH CLASS HYDROPLANE AND AT THE SAME SITE, BUT WITH "LITTLE MISS CANADA IV."
- 1936: USING A LARGER HYDROPLANE HE ENTERED AND GAINED EXPERIENCE IN THE GOLD CUP RACE ON LAKE GEORGE.
- 1939: HE ENTERED THE RACE ON THE POTOMAC RIVER AND WON THE PRESIDENT'S CUP.
- 1949: ON OCTOBER 2ND ON PICTON BAY, HAROLD ACTUALLY BEAT SIR MALCOLM CAMPBELL'S RECORD OF 141.7 M.P.H., BUT HAD TROUBLE ON THE RETURN RUN. AS THE RECORD IS BASED ON THE AVERAGE SPEED OF BOTH RUNS, THE NATIONAL RACING COMMISSION COULD NOT RECOGNIZE HIS RACE FOR THE WORLD'S RECORD.

1950: MISS CANADA WAS ENTERED IN THE FAMOUS HARMSWORTH RACES ON THE DETROIT RIVER. THE BOAT WAS POWERED BY THE FAMOUS ROLLS ROYCE MERLIN ENGINES WHICH HAD BEEN USED IN THE SPITFIRE AND LANCASTER PLANES DURING WORLD WAR II. HAROLD HAD THE BOAT TO DO THE JOB BUT ENGINE PROBLEMS PLAGUED

HIS EFFORTS BOTH YEARS.

1974: HE WAS ELECTED TO THE CANADIAN SPORTS HALL OF FAME IN TORONTO.



ON MARCH 15, 1937, INGERSOLL DEFEATED BRANTFORD 22-6 TO WIN THE ONTARTIO Y.M.C.A. BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP. COACH-MANAGER-PLAYER MARY JOHNSTON WAS ONE OF THE TEAM-MATES FROM THE ORIGINAL TEAM THAT WAS FORMED IN 1932 WHEN THE LEAGUE STARTED UP ITS OPERATIONS KNOWN AS THE ONTARIO Y.M.C.A. BASKETBALL ASSOCIATION. TEAM CAPTAIN HELEN LEFAIVE WAS INGERSOLL'S TOP SCORER WITH 14 OF THE TEAMS 22 POINTS. THIS WAS THE FIRST YEAR THAT THE GIRLS HAD TO PLAY "BOYS RULES". THIS CHAMPION-SHIP TITLE WAS IMPORTANT TO INGERSOLL AS BRANTFORD DEFEATED THEM IN THE 1935 CHAMPIONSHIP GAME AND THEY WERE RELEGATED TO HOLD ONTO THE ONTARIO FINALISTS TROPHY THAT YEAR.

IN THE 1938 CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES, INGERSOLL HAD TO COME UP AGAINST AN UNDEFEATED KITCHENER TEAM IN A BEST TWO OUT OF THREE SERIES. INGERSOLL WON THE OPENING GAME 18-17 WITH MARY JOHNSTON SINKING THE WINNING BASKET WITH JUST SECONDS TO PLAY. THE SECOND GAME OF THE SERIES WAS PLAYED IN KITCHENER ON APRIL 11, 1938 WITH KITCHENER WINNING THAT GAME BY A 19-17 SCORE TO FORCE A THIRD AND DECIDING GAME. GAME THREE WAS PLAYED ON NEUTRAL GROUNDS IN STRATFORD ON APRIL 14 WITH INGERSOLL WINNING THEIR SECOND CONSECUTIVE TITLE BY KNOCKING OFF KITCHENER WITH A 17-12 VICTORY SCORE. HELEN LEFAIVE SCORED THIRTEEN POINTS AND JEAN KENNEDY ADDED FOUR POINTS TO COMPLETE INGERSOLL'S SCORING.

IN QUEST OF THEIR THIRD CONSECUTIVE TITLE, INGERSOLL LOST ONLY ONE REGULAR SEASON GAME AND THAT WAS TO ST. THOMAS IN THEIR LAST LEAGUE GAME OF THE YEAR. INGERSOLL WOULD MEET GUELPH IN THE 1939 CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS AND FOR THE SECOND CONSECUTIVE YEAR INGERSOLL WOULD FACE AN UNDEFEATED TEAM IN THE CHAMPIONSHIP TWO OUT OF THREE SERIES. INGERSOLL WON THE OPENING GAME ON MARCH 27TH BY A SCORE OF 22-9. THE SECOND GAME OF THE SERIES WAS PLAYED ON APRIL 4TH AND INGERSOLL ROLLED OVER GUELPH BY A SCORE OF 31-16, TO SWEEP THE CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES. IN THE SECOND GAME HELEN LEFAIVE HAD 21 POINTS, MARY JOHNSTON HAD 6 POINTS, MARY WILDE HAD 2 POINTS, AND ARLENE GREENAWAY HAD 2 POINTS.





Junior B Champions FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS THE HEATING AND AIR CONDITIONING COMPANY CENTRAL HEATING (OWNER JOHN VANDYKE) HAD SPONSORED A MEN'S FASTBALL TEAM IN THE WOODSTOCK IBI LEAGUE CULMINATING WITH THE CHAMPIONSHIP IN 1967. AFTER THE 1968 SEASON, PLAYERS STARTED TO JOIN THE NEW INGERSOLL LEAGUE FORMED WITH THE INSTALLATION OF LIGHTS AT THE NEW WESTFIELD DIAMOND. ONE OF THE PLAYERS, DOUG HARRIS, A TEACHER AT THE HIGH SCHOOL SPOKE TO A NUMBER OF STUDENTS ABOUT FORMING A JUNIOR TEAM. JOINING HIM AS COACH WERE ED ELLIS AND MIKE HUTT FROM THE OLD TEAM. IN

THIS NEW GROUP PLAYED BETTER BALL EACH YEAR AND IN 1974 THEY DEFEATED ELLIOTT LAKE 2 GAMES TO O BY SCORES OF 23-2, 14-4 IN THE NICKEL TOWN TO WIN THE JUNIOR B CROWN, INGERSOLL'S FIRST FASTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP. THEY HAD DEFEATED STRATHROY, SIMCOE, AND DOMVILLE ON THE WAY TO THE NORTH. ONLY COACH HARRIS AND PITCHER AL MESSENGER REMAINED FROM THE ORIGINAL 1969 TEAM.

GEORGE HAYES WHO WROTE FOR THE WOODSTOCK SENTINEL-REVIEW AND FOLLOWED THE JUNIORS FAITHFULLY STATED THAT A TRUE CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM IS ONE THAT CAN REPEAT. IN 1975 HARV FISHLEIGH REPLACED COACH REID AND A NEW YOUNG PITCHER BILL RIDDICK FROM BEACHVILLE TOOK OVER FROM AN OVERAGE MESSENGER. THEY DEFEATED STRATHROY, SIMCOE, AND VERONA (AN EXCITING THREE GAME SERIES) TO WIN THE SOUTHERN ONTARIO CHAMPIONSHIP. MUCH WORK WENT INTO HOSTING THE FIRST EVER ALL ONTARIO CHAMPIONSHIP AT WESTFIELD. THE OPPOSITION WAS AGAIN ELLIOTT LAKE, ONLY THIS TIME THEY WERE A MORE FORMIDABLE ADVERSARY. WITH PITCHER RIDDICK (SUPPORTED BY RON FORBES) PERFORMING BRILLIANTLY, INGERSOLL CLIMATE CONTROL JUNIORS WON THEIR SECOND STRAIGHT JUNIOR B CROWN IN TWO GAMES BY SCORES OF 1-0 (14 INNINGS) AND 4-0.

THE TEAM STILL OPERATES TODAY (1987) WITH COACH FISHLEIGH AT THE HELM. CLIMATE CONTROL SPONSORSHIP ENDED IN 1980, BUT NOT BEFORE A SUCCESSFUL SPORTS STORY HAD BEEN FASHIONED BY SOME OUTSTANDING ATHLETES. INGERSOLL CLIMATE CONTROL JUNIORS HAD WON MANY TOWN LEAGUE, TOURNAMENT, ZONE, AND SOUTHERN ONTARIO CHAMPIONSHIPS HIGHLIGHTED BY TWO ONTARIO AMATEUR SOFTBALL ASSOCIATION JUNIOR B TITLES.




Ralph Beemer Sr.

- 1928 HE PITCHED FOR INGERSOLL IN THE INTERCOUNTY LEAGUE. IN THE FIRST GAME OF THE SEASON HE STRUCK OUT 21 STRATFORD BATTERS--INGERSOLL WON 18-1.
- 1930 WHEN INGERSOLL WON THE ONTARIO BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP, BEEMER WENT IN TO PITCH IN RELIEF IN A PLAY OFF GAME IN THE 3RD INNING AGAINST HARROW, WITH INGERSOLL LOSING 4-1. BEEMER STRUCK OUT 18 BATTERS, ALLOWED ONLY ONE HIT AND WENT ON TO WIN 5-4. INGERSOLL WENT ON TO WIN THE O.B.A. TITLE AGAINST PETERBOROUGH.
- 1931-35 HE PLAYED FOR INGERSOLL.
 - 1936 HE PITCHED AND MANAGED THE WOODSTOCK RED SOX WHICH WON THE ONTARIO INTERMEDIATE "C" CHAMPIONSHIP.
 - 1937 HE RETURNED TO INGERSOLL WHERE HE COACHED AND PITCHED THE TEAM TO AN INTERMEDIATE "B" CHAMPIONSHIP. BEEMER ALSO PLAYED HOCKEY FOR SIMCOE AND INGERSOLL, AS A HARD HITTING DEFENCEMAN.
- 1935-36 IN THIS SEASON, HE ORGANIZED A LEAGUE IN THE ONTARIO JUVENILE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION CONSISTING OF TWO WOODSTOCK TEAMS, NORWICH, TILLSONBURG AND INGERSOLL. THE GROUP CHAMPIONSHIP WAS WON BY INGERSOLL WHO THEN ELIMINATED KITCHENER AND SIMCOE BEFORE MEETING HAMILTON IN THE SEMI-FINALS. HAMILTON WON THE TWO GAME TOTAL GOALS SERIES 7-6.

BEEMER WAS A FINE ORGANIZER OF SPORT TEAMS AND AFTER HIS RETIREMENT IN SPORTS. PROMOTED BOTH BASEBALL AND HOCKEY TEAMS IN INGERSOLL, AS WELL AS MANAGED THE OLD ARENA FOR SOME YEARS.

ALSO, HE WAS A SUCCESSFUL BUSINESS MAN, OWNING HIS OWN RESTAURANT AND TAXI BUSINESS.








Joe Foster

BYRON WAS BORN IN THE VILLAGE OF HAWTREY, SOUTH NORWICH IN 1881. HE RECEIVED HIS EDUCATION IN THE INGERSOLL SCHOOL SYSTEM. AFTER EARNING HIS TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE, BYRON TAUGHT AT SALFORD PUBLIC SCHOOL FOR 3 YEARS EARNING \$350 PER YEAR. FOLLOWING THAT HE TOOK UP FARMING EAST OF INGERSOLL, WHILE STILL DOING SOME SUPPLY TEACHING AT FOLDENS AND SWEABURG. HE WAS ALSO CLERK TREASURER FOR WEST OXFORD FROM 1908 - 1918.

BYRON JOINED THE INGERSOLL LAWN BOWLING CLUB IN 1927 AND ATTENDED OVER 50 ANNUAL CLUB MEETINGS.

IN 1954 ALONG WITH FELLOW RINK MEMBERS ALBERT WARHAM, BRYON MCCARTY AND A.E. IZZARD, THEY WON THE PROVINCIAL LAWN BOWLING CHAMPIONSHIP. THE SAME RINK IN 1958 WAS PROVINCIAL FINALISTS.

BETWEEN 1950 - 1970 BYRON PLAYED IN 144 OPEN TOURNAMENTS AND BOWLED ON AT LEAST 50 DIFFERENT GREENS. HE WAS STILL A VERY ACTIVE BOWLER AT THE AGE OF 95. BYRON HAD A LONG RETIREMENT IN INGERSOLL AND WAS A GREAT HISTORIAN, KEEPING RECORDS DATING BACK TO THE 1800'S.

BYRON WAS THE INGERSOLL LEGION BRANCH 119 "CITIZEN OF THE YEAR" IN 1976. HE PASSED AWAY FEBRUARY 1980, JUST SHORT OF HIS 100TH BIRTH-DAY.



Don Lord

DON WAS BORN IN EDMONTON, ALBERTA IN 1932. THEY MOVED TO KENORA, WHERE HE COMPLETED HIS SCHOOLING. DURING THIS TIME, HE TOOK AN ARDENT INTEREST IN CURLING. IN 1962, HE ATTENDED THE ONTARIO COLLEGE OF EDUCATION IN TORONTO, AND THE FOLLOWING YEAR HE MOVED HIS FAMILY TO INGERSOLL WHERE HE ACCEPTED A TEACHING POSITION AT THE INGERSOLL COLLEGIATE.

DON STILL RESIDES IN INGERSOLL WHERE HE HAS A KEEN INTEREST IN CURLING AND GOLF.

Gordon W. Pittock

GORD WAS BORN IN 1909 AND RAISED IN INGERSOLL WHERE HE RECEIVED HIS EDUCATION IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM. HE LATER ATTENDED NIGHT SCHOOL CLASSES AT H.B. BEALE TECHNICAL SCHOOL IN LONDON.

GORD BEGAN WORK IN THE FERTILIZER INDUSTRY FOR WILLIAM STONE AND SONS IN 1923 AND RETIRED AS PLANT MANAGER 49 YEARS LATER. GORD WAS ACTIVE IN SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION. HE WAS CHAIRMAN OF THE UPPER THAMES RIVER CONSERVATION AUTHORITY FROM 1951-1965, AND BECAME AN HONOURARY MEMBER IN 1970. IN 1964, THE U.T.R.C.A. NAMED THE MAN-MADE LAKE IN WOODSTOCK, THE GORDON PITTOCK DAM, IN HIS HONOUR FOR HIS MANY YEARS OF SERVICE. GORD WAS OXFORD COUNTY'S MEMBER OF THE ONTARIO LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY AT QUEEN'S PARK FROM 1963-67.

BESIDES BEING A VERY ACTIVE COMMUNITY PERSON, GORD WAS ONE OF INGERSOLL'S LEADING SPORTSMEN AND BUILDERS. HE MANAGED THE INGERSOLL OLYMPIC SOFTBALL TEAM AND WAS ALSO SECRETARY OF THE INTERMEDIATE O.H.A. HOCKEY CLUB BETWEEN 1926-28. GORD WAS ONE OF THE ORIGINAL BUILDERS OF MINOR SPORTS AND PLAYGROUND PROGRAMMES FOR INGERSOLL DURING THE 1940'S.

GORD SERVED AS CHAIRMAN IN 1950 OF THE Y'S MEN'S CLUB PROJECT TO PURCHASE AND REHABILITATE THE OLD THAYER ARENA INCLUDING THE INSTALLATION OF ARTIFICIAL ICE.

GORD WAS PRESIDENT OF THE INGERSOLL DISTRICT COMMUNITY CENTRE FOR SEVEN YEARS. THIS FACILITY WAS LATER DESTROYED BY FIRE IN DECEMBER 1955.

IN 1956, GORD SERVED AS SECRETARY OF THE CITIZEN'S STEERING COMMITTEE AND WAS ACTIVE IN THE PROMOTION AND COMPLETION OF THE PRESENT INGERSOLL DISTRICT MEMORIAL CENTRE. GORD WAS ALSO CHAIRMAN OF THE INGERSOLL RECREATION COMMISSION IN ITS FIRST YEAR OF ORGANIZATION.

GORD WAS ONE OF THE ORIGINAL DIRECTOR/MEMBERS WHO FOUNDED AND DEVELOPED THE INGERSOLL GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB IN 1952. HE WAS INVOLVED IN PURCHASING THE PROPERTY THAT THE GOLF COURSE IS LOCATED ON. FOR HIS MANY YEARS OF SERVICE AND WORK ON THE GOLF CLUB EXECUTIVE, GORD AND HIS WIFE LOUISE, WERE AWARDED WITH LIFE MEMBERSHIPS ON SEPTEMBER 29, 1979.

GORD PASSED AWAY IN 1983 AFTER HAVING GIVEN MANY YEARS OF DEDICATION AND INVOLVEMENT TO THE TOWN OF INGERSOLL.




Max Poole

MAX WAS BORN IN DECEMBER 1911 ON A FARM AT HAGLES CORNER IN WEST OXFORD TOWNSHIP. HE ATTENDED SALFORD PUBLIC SCHOOL. MAX WORKED FOR THE WILLIAM STONE & SONS COMPANY FOR 30 YEARS BEFORE MOVING TO WATERLOO WHERE HE TRAVELLED FOR AN ANIMAL MILK PRODUCTS COMPANY. HIS LAST 15 YEARS BEFORE RETIREMENT WERE SPENT AS A SALES REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE STEWART SEED COMPANY.

MAX PLAYED JUNIOR FOOTBALL WITH THE WOODSTOCK GRADS COACHED BY THE LATE L.A. WENDLING FOR THREE YEARS FROM 1930-1932, INCLUDING THE 1931 TEAM WHICH WON THE CANADIAN JUNIOR FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP. WOODSTOCK DEFEATED MOOSE JAW FOR THE TITLE.

AFTER WWII, MAX WAS A MEMBER OF THE Y'S MEN'S CLUB WHO ORGANIZED AND COACHED MINOR SPORTS IN INGERSOLL. ALSO THROUGH THEIR EFFORTS, AN ARTIFICIALICE SYSTEM WAS PUT IN THE OLD THAYERS ARENA. AFTER THE THAYERS ARENA BURNT DOWN IN DECEMBER 1955, MAX WAS A MEMBER OF THE CITIZENS COMMITTEE INVOLVED IN THE REBUILDING PROGRAM. MAX WAS IN CHARGE OF PUBLICITY. THROUGH BOBBY BAUER, MAX HAD 2 PLAYERS OFF THE CANADIAN OLYMPIC HOCKEY TEAM SPEAK TO 1800 STUDENTS AT THE INGERSOLL SCHOOLS. ALONG WITH HIMSELF THE STUDENTS SOLD BUTTONS SAYING "WE ARE ON THE MARCH \$100,000 I.D.M.C." THIS WAS VERY SUCCESSFUL, AND ALL KIDS SAVED MONEY FOR THE NEW COMMUNITY CENTRE WHICH WAS OFFICIALLY OPENED ON OCTOBER 5 1979. THE OPENING EVENT WAS AN AMERICAN LEAGUE GAME BETWEEN BUFFALO AND ROCHESTER.

MAX AND HIS WIFE PHYLLIS NOW RESIDE IN WOODSTOCK.



Fred Vale

"FREDDIE" CAME FROM BEACHVILLE AND WAS ONE OF THE BEST RIGHT HANDED PITCHERS EVER IN OXFORD COUNTY. FREDDIE HAD GREAT SPEED AND CONTROL OF ALL HIS PITCHES INCLUDING THE CHANGE UP. DURING HIS LONG ILLUSTRIOUS CAREER HE PITCHED FOR TEAMS FROM BEACHVILLE, WOODSTOCK, TILLSONBURG, LONDON ARMY AND INGERSOLL.

IN 1946 WHILE PITCHING FOR THE CYANAMID CO. TEAM, HE STRUCK OUT 36 AND WALKED ONLY ONE CANADIAN LEGION TEAM BATTER IN A 18 INNING 2-1 LOSS.

IN 1948 FREDDIE HAD HIS GREATEST DAY PITCHING. AT A TOURNAMENT IN DORCHESTR, HE PITCHED AND WON ALL THREE GAMES (28 INNINGS) INCLUDING THE CHAMPIONSHIP FOR WALKER'S FRIGIDAIRES. THAT YEAR HE ALSO PITCHED FOR STANDARD TUBE IN THE WOODSTOCK FASTBALL LEAGUE. INCLUDING TOURNA-MENTS HE PITCHED A TOTAL OF 77 GAMES THAT YEAR.

NO RECORD WAS KEPT OF HOW MANY GAMES HE WON DURING HIS 25 YEAR CAREER BUT HE WON FAR MORE THAN HE LOST.

FRED WAS ALSO AN AVID GOLFER UNTIL HIS SUDDEN DEALTH IN 1985.



Preston T. (P.T.) Walker

P.T. WAS BORN ON A FARM NEAR MILVERTON, ONTARIO AND MOVED TO INGERSOLL FROM WALKERTON IN 1934. HE SUCCESSFULLY OWNED AND OPERATED A FURNITURE AND UNDERTAKING BUSINESS IN INGERSOLL FOR MANY YEARS. THE FURNITURE BUSINESS IS STILL RUN IN THE FAMILY NAME BY HIS SON MERIDITH.

WHILE HE WAS IN WALKERTON, HE WAS VERY ACTIVE IN HOCKEY, SOCCER AND BASEBALL, SERVING ON MANY EXECUTIVES AND WAS ALSO THE SECRETARY OF THE WALKERTON INTERMEDIATE HOCKEY CLUB OF 1929-1930, THAT LOST TO PARIS IN THE ONTARIO HOCKEY ASSOCIATION FINALS. AND IN 1933 WHEN THE GOOD WALKERTON CLUB PLAYED WOODSTOCK IN THE ONTARIO SEMI FINALS.

P.T. WAS THE SPONSOR OF MANY TEAMS OVER THE YEARS IN INGERSOLL FOR SOFTBALL AND HOCKEY. PROBABLY HIS BEST CLUB WAS THE WALKER FRIGIDAIRES IN THE MEMORIAL LEAGUE WHICH INCLUDED LONDON, STRATFORD, BRANTFORD, KITCHENER AND GUELPH, WITH FREDDIE VALE CARRYING THE PITCHING LOAD. HE ALWAYS CALLED HIS TEAMS THE "FRIDIDAIRES".

P.T. DIED IN 1979, BUT OVER THE YEARS THE TOWN REAPED BENEFITS FROM HIS INVOLVEMENT IN LOCAL SPORTS.



Dr. Ralph Williams


HE WAS A VERY RESPECTED PHYSICIAN AND SPORTSMAN DURING HIS LIFE-TIME IN INGERSOLL.

DURING HIS YOUNGER YEARS RALPH PLAYED PROFESSIONAL BASEBALL WITH MT. AIRY, MARYLAND IN THE EASTERN SHORE LEAGUE.

IN 1906 HE FORMED A VERY GOOD SEMI-PRO TEAM IN INGERSOLL WHICH INCLUDED MANY IMPORTS AND HIMSELF AS THE FIRST BASEMAN.

DR. WILLIAMS WAS BEST KNOWN FOR THE MANY YEARS OF COACHING AND SPONSORING MINOR BASEBALL IN INGERSOLL.

THE MOST SUCCESSFUL TEAM HE COACHED WAS THE 1932 INGERSOLL JUVENILE BASEBALL CLUB. THEY WON THE INTERCOUNTY LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP AND ADVANCED TO THE ONTARIO SEMIFINAL PLAYDOWNS AGAINST NIAGARA FALLS. INGERSOLL LOST THE SERIES TO NIAGARA FALLS IN THIRD AND DECIDING GAME.

HE WAS BORN IN INGERSOLL ON SEPTEMBER 1ST 1970, AND PRESENTLY IS ATTENDING I.D.C.I.

DOUG STARTED TRAPSHOOTING WHEN HE WAS 11 YEARS OLD AT THE ONE-TRAP RANGE AT THE OXFORD SPORTSMEN'S CLUB, NEAR INGERSOLL.

JUST TWO YEARS LATER IN VANDALIA, OHIO, U.S.A., THE 13 YEAR OLD SUB-JUNIOR BECAME THE SECOND YOUNGEST SHOOTER TO WIN A MAJOR CHAMPIONSHIP IN THE 85 YEAR HISTORY OF THE GRAND AMERICAN TRAPSHOOT.
