but Your Petitioner lost the land in Missouri
in consequence of the same being re-located
by another individual -

Your Petitioner therefore prays
that inasmuch as he has already proved
his fathers right to 200 acres of land beyond
the land in Iowa for which a Patent has
issued, and the right of Your Petitioner
thereto as Heir at Law; that Your
Excellency may direct a certificate to be
granted to him from the Surveyor General
authorising him to locate two hundred acres
of land, or certifying his right to that quantity
as Heir at Law of William Stevens deceased.
