

To His Excellency Sir Charles Bagot,
 G. C. B. Governor General of the Province of
 Canada In Council,

The Petition of Frederick Stevens -
 eldest surviving son and heir at law
 of William Stevens late of the Town-
 ship of Niagara deceased.

Sheweth
 That the said William Stevens in
 his life time was entitled to and did
 locate lot 1st 16 in the First Concession
 Niagara and the west half of number
 14 in the Fourth Concession of Lorain.
 That shortly after such location the said
 William Stevens the Father of your Pe-
 titioner died, leaving your Petitioner
 with several other children quite young
 That during his minority there being
 no person to interest themselves in the
 matter the said lot of land was
 relocated to William J. Rose in consequence
 of the settlement duties not having been
 performed.

That your Petitioner was not aware of
 such being the fact until he petitioned the
 Council to be allowed to locate the said lot as
 Heir at law of the said William Stevens when
 he was informed that the said lot was
 relocated as above mentioned. The said
 lot is of great value, and to your Petitioner
 if he is deprived thereof will be a severe loss.
 And your Petitioner trusts that he will be
 allowed to locate a lot of land in lieu of the
 said lot - as heir of the said William Stevens
 or if not that at least, there may be granted
 to your Petitioner, some in lieu thereof.

Frederick Stevens

Lot Number 1425 on the first
concession of the Township of Repulse was
located to William Stevens (under Act in
Council of the 9th of February 1829) as the
son of an A. E. Legatist.
This lot has been since located and
described for Patent in the name of
William G. Steen

The West half of Lot Number fourteen in
the fourth Concession of Gorea was located
under the Applicant Genl. Cuthbert in
the name of William Stevens as a partner
in Capt. John Powell's Company of Militia
Artillery, and has been since allowed under
the same name and described for Patent
to Frederick Stevens as heir at law of Wm. Stevens.
