The Petition of Thomas Mackintosh
of the City of Toronto Gentlemen -

Respectfully Sheweth -

That your petitioner having
read in the Upper Canada Gazette a
Notice calling on Hannah Brown or her
Representative to make good her claim
to Lot number Two in the Second Concession
of the Western Division of the Township of
Oxford in the District of London, begs
leave to submit to your Excellency the
following Statement -

On the 2nd May 1797 Hannah Brown
deceased to one James Field a Barrister at
Law to apply for and take out the
King's Patent for Lot No 2 in the 3rd
Concession of Oxford West and became
bound in the sum of Two hundred pounds
to convey the same or to procure a conveyance
thereof to the said James Field; and at the
same time executed a Memorandum of Sale
of the same Lot to the said James Field and
authorized and empowered him to sell and
convey the said Land to any person he saw
fit - James Field died intestate,
without issue - Charles Field his Brother
inherited to him who also died intestate,
leaving a son James Field his Heir at Law -
On the 3rd July 1829 James Field the Heir

Lot number Two in the Third Commission upon examination proves to be a Clergy Reserve but from a perusal of the documents above mentioned your Petitioner has reason to believe that the said Hannah Brown intended to transfer to the said James Field Lot No. 2 in the 2nd Commission of Oxford West - it being the Lot for which she is located -

In consideration of the foregoing statement your Petitioner humbly prays that your Excellency will be pleased to stay any further proceedings in reference to the said Lot, till the sitting of the Commission under the Act and Devises Act, so that an opportunity may be afforded to the said Samuel Platt to prefer and establish his claim to the above mentioned Land
