mind and judgment thanks be to God  
the Almighty for all his mercies, and wish-  
ing to dispose of my property in the follow-  
ing manner. I do hereby make and publish  
this my last will and testament.

First I pray, Almighty God to have mercy  
on my never dying soul, Amen.

Secondly I wish all my lawful debts to be  
paid. Further I bequeath and devise to my  
wife Catherine the west half of the North  
West quarter of Lot number Fourteen in the first  
concession of the Township of Bleuhelm aforesaid  
together with all privileges to the same belonging  
subject nevertheless to the following condition  
namely that in the event of my wife Cath-  
erine Swarts marrying a second time or at  
her death, that then and in either case the  
above named property shall be sold and the  
proceeds thereof be equally divided amongst  
my four brothers and sister, namely Ann  
Service, Peter Swarts, Philip Swarts, William  
Swarts, John Swarts or their heirs, and further

I will and bequeath to my Wife Catherine  
Isaacs Two Cows, Six Sheep and all my House  
Hold furniture and Goods, I also will and  
bequeath to my Sister Mary Catherine Swarts  
the privilege of occupying and professing  
the apartments in my Dwelling house, the same  
she now lives in subject nevertheless to the control  
of my Executors herein after named, further  
I do hereby name and appoint my Brothers  
William Swarts of the Township of Blenheim Ontario  
and Alexander Milmine of the same place Dan-  
-ever, Executors of this my last Will and Testament  
hereby revoking all former Wills or Codicils made  
by me I declare this to be my last Will and  
Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto set  
My hand and Seal this Thirtieth day of March  
in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight  
Hundred and Forty Three.
