of Oxford, on the River Thames: That your Peti-
-tioner is very desirous to become a good settler
in the Province, therefore humbly prays your
Excellency to grant him a Lot on Dundas Street
in the new Division of Oxford, north of the
Thames - upon the usual terms of Settlement
under the new Regulations, and as in duty bound
