The humble petition of Michael Bailey of the
town of York

Sheweth That in April 1816 your petitioner
received a grant of the north half of lot No. 14. in the
1st Concession of Charlotteville, as a discharged soldier
from His Majesty's 5th Regt of Foot. Upon going to the
London District for the purpose of improving his land
your petitioner found it partly in a swamp the remainder
is sandy and totally unfit for cultivation
And further your petitioner begs leave to state that
one John Ennis who received a grant about the
same time with your petitioner for the south half
of the said lot number four, was allowed to file an
application to your Excellency to charge the same
for another lot, owing to its being bad land.

Your petitioner therefore humbly
prays your Excellency in Council
will be pleased to allow him, for
lot No. 17. in broken concession B. in
the township of Etobicoke, a crown
reserve, in lieu of the said 100 acres
in Charlotteville, and as is duty
bound your petitioner shall ever
pray
