See two subsequent Petitions One read in Council  
4<sup>th</sup> February 1849 when he was only a lease of  
Lot No 21 in the 1<sup>st</sup> Concession Eastern Division of  
Bedford a Crown Roster - the other in Council  
12<sup>th</sup> November 1823 when he was recommended  
for a Grant in fee simple.
