be given embracing the lands intended
to be granted thereby and designating
as lot No. 22 in the 3^d Concession of the
Township of Alfred East - formerly known
as lot A in the 1st Concession East of the
Alfred.

Further Mr Topping presents as
evidence from John Bowden of the

Lot B in the Gore between East & West Alfred
 together with the Crown Patent to the latter;
 upon which a Surrender is enclosed. - The
 Surrender is dated 30th Nov 1838 and in
 the Affidavit by Mr. Topping before referred to
 he states that the title to the lot also is
 still vested in him. - The Patent was
 intended to embrace according to Mr. James
 Burwell's map thirty two lines, and the
 object of the Surrender is to acquire a new
 Grant for the Gore between Lot A-22 and
 the 1st & 2^d Companies of West Alfred. - This
 Gore it appears from the accompanying
 plan by Deputy Surveyor Robert Syme
 dated 5th May 1848 contains fifty eight
 lines - and it is recommended that the
 Surrender be accepted and that a Patent
 be given in the name of Edward Topping
 for the Westby 32 lines thereof designating it
 as part of Lot A (formerly known as Lot B) in the
 Gore between East & West Alfred - The arrangement
 now suggested is in conformity with the Report from
 the Office of the 18th June 1848 upon the respective
 Petitions of Edward Topping & John Rowden

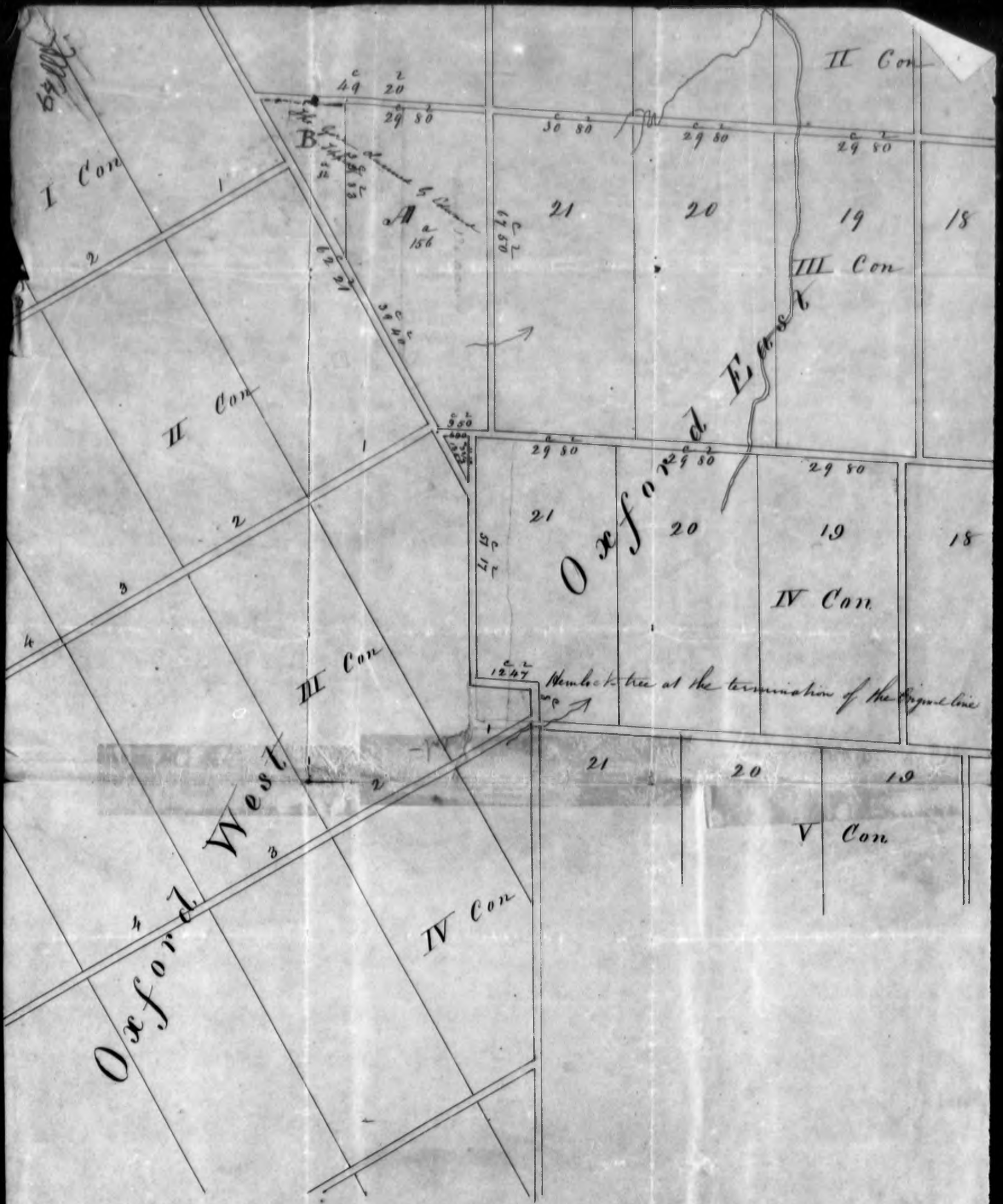
