Thomas Ingersoll of the Township of Oxford in the
the District of London in the Province of Upper Canada
Esquire - late Comptroller of the said Township of
Oxford - who made oath, that in the year 1796 or
1797, he recommended a certain Reuben Trull
for Lot N: Nineteen in the second conception of the
said Township of Oxford, Western Division - That
the said Reuben Trull was never in the said Town-
-ship of Oxford (having come no further than Queenstown)
that he never has made or caused to be made any
improvement upon the said Lot & never occupied the
same, and that it is now about seven years since
he returned to the United States, and has never since
been in this Province to the deponent's knowledge
or belief
