In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Underhill Considering the uncertainty of this life and being of sound and perfect mind and memory Blessed be Almighty God for the same do make and publish this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Underhill the sum of twenty pounds to be paid in two years after my decease I do also give and bequeath to my two sons James H Underhill and John Underhill their heirs and assigns the following pieces or parcels of Land lying in the Township of Burford in the County of Oxford in the District of Brock and Province of Canada fifty acres being the North quarter of Lot Number one in the fifth Concession of said Township of Burford and may be known as follows that is to say Commencing at the North East angle of said Lot Number one Then south fifteen degrees and forty minutes East sixteen chains and eighty five links Then south seventy eight degrees and thirty minutes West twenty nine chains and thirty links Then North fifteen degrees and forty minutes West sixteen chains and eighty five links the North seventy eight degrees and thirty minutes East twenty nine chains and thirty links to the place of beginning likewise twenty five acres being the North half of the South West quarter of Lot Number two in the fourth Concession of said Township and may be known as follows Commencing North fifteen degrees and forty minutes West sixteen chains and eighty five links from the South West angle of said Lot Number two Then North seventy eight degrees and thirty minutes East fourteen chains and sixty five links Then North fifteen degrees and forty minutes West sixteen chains and eighty five links Then south seventy eight degrees and thirty minutes West fourteen chains and sixty five links Then south fifteen degrees and forty minutes East sixteen chains and eighty five links to the place of beginning likewise thirty seven acres of Land lying in the Township of Brantford in the County of Wentworth in the District of Gore and said Province of Canada the same being composed of parts of Lots Number one and two in the third Concession of said Township of Brantford and may be -

Known as follows Commencing in the Original Indian line on the East side of the allowance for road between the Townships of Bramford and Burford and twelve Chains and fifty links North of the allowance for road between the third and fourth Concession. Then North seventy Eight degrees and thirty minutes East forty Chains then North fifteen degrees and forty minutes West nine chains and twenty five links then South seventy Eight degrees and thirty minutes West forty Chains more or less to the Indian line as aforesaid then South fifteen degrees and forty minutes East nine Chains and twenty five links to the place of beginning. I do also give and bequeath to my two sons William Underhill and Thomas Underhill their heirs and assigns the following pieces or parcels of land that is to say Eighty seven acres being composed of parts of lots Number one and two in the third Concession of the aforesaid Township of Bramford and may be known as follows Commencing in the Original Indian line as aforesaid twenty one chains and seventy five links North of the allowance for road between the third and fourth Concession then North seventy Eight degrees and thirty minutes East forty Chains then North fifteen degrees and forty minutes West twenty one chains and seventy five links then South seventy Eight degrees and thirty minutes West forty chains to the Indian line as aforesaid then South fifteen degrees and forty minutes East twenty one chains and seventy five links to the place of beginning. Like wise twenty five acres being the south half of the south West quarter of Lot Number two in the fourth Concession of the aforesaid Township of Burford and may be known as follows Commencing South seventy Eight degrees and thirty minutes West fourteen Chains and sixty five links from the South East angle of said Lot then North fifteen degrees and forty minutes West sixteen Chains and eighty five links then South seventy Eight degrees and thirty minutes West fourteen Chain and sixty five links then South fifteen degrees and forty minutes East sixteen Chains and eighty five links then South seventy Eight degrees and thirty minutes West fourteen Chains and sixty five links to the place of beginning.



I do also give and bequeath to my Wife Mary Underhill all my Moveable property to be at her disposal together with a comfortable maintainance in sickness and in health during her natural life I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons James W Underhill William Underhill and Thomas Underhill Executors to this my Last Will and testament
