Know all men by these Presents that I
William Wenderhill of the Township of Burford
District of Brock and Province of Canada do
make and Publish this my last Will
and Testament in the manner and Form
following That is to say I Will and bequeath
to my Executors my equal undivided half
of Eighty seven Acres of Land Willed me by
my Father being parts of Lots No one and
two on the third Concession Township
of Brantford County of Wentworth Which
may be known as follows Commencing
in the original Indian Line twenty
one Chains and seventy five Links
North of the allowance for road between
the third and fourth Concessions Then
North seventy eight degrees and thirty
minutes East forty Chains Then North
fifteen degrees and forty minutes West
twenty one Chains and seventy five Links
South seventy eight degrees and thirty minutes
West forty Chains to the Indian Line as it
was said then south fifteen degrees and
forty minutes East twenty one Chains
and seventy five Links to the place of
beginning Likewise my equal undivided
half of twenty five Acres being the south
half of the southwest Quarter of Lot No two
in the fourth Concession of the aforesaid
Township of Burford And may be known
as follows Commencing south seventy eight

degrees and thirty minutes West fourteen
Chains and sixty five Links from the south
east angle of the said Lot then North
fifteen degrees and forty minutes West
sixteen Chains and eighty five Links then
south seventy eight degrees and thirty
minutes West fourteen Chains and sixty
five Links then south fifteen degrees and
forty minutes East fifteen Chains and
eighty five Links then South Seventy
eight degrees and thirty minutes West
fourteen Chains and sixty five Links to
the place of beginning Likewise my right
to fifty Acres of Land being the West Quarter of
Lot No four in the third Concession of
Bradford For the benefit and support of my
Wife Phoebe and my dear Children Lydia
Mary and Jane And I thereby authorize
and empower my said Executors to dispose
of and convey by Deed of conveyance a
part of the whole of the said Property as
they may deem proper for the support
and maintenance of my dear Family I
likewise Will and bequeath to my Wife
Phoebe my household furniture Stock and
moveable property after paying my just
Debts and Funeral Charges Whatever power
or authority I give to my Executors I
also grant to my Executrix And I
herby constitute and appointe my
Wife Phoebe Wenderhill Executrix

And my trusty and wellbeloved
Friends Enoch Palmer Sr. Caleb
Merrill and my Brother Thomas
Wunderhill Executors to this my last
Will and Testament
