The Petition of Drury Thompson and Robert Bouchier both of the Township
of Blethen in the County of Essex Executors named in the last
Will and Testament of the late Matthew Weston late of the said Township
Essex deceased.

Sheweth

That the late Matthew Weston late of the Township aforesaid deceased
departed this life at Blethen aforesaid on or about the twentieth day of June
now last past having first on the twenty third day of June last in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty eight duly made and published
his last Will and Testament in writing whereby he appointed your Petitioners
Executors of the said Will, That the said deceased at the time of his death
was possessed of or entitled to divers goods and Chattels rights and Credits
all within the County of Essex amounting in the whole to the sum of
Eighty three pounds three Shillings and seven pence in the receipt of which
your Petitioners have been enabled to ascertain That your Petitioners are
desirous of paying on themselves the duties of Executors of the said Will and
of settling and proving the same Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray
your Honors will be please to permit them to exhibit and prove the said
Will And your Petitioners as in duty bound will ever pray.

In the name of God, Amen I Matthew Upton of the Town-
ship of Blewheim in the County of Oxford in the dis-
trict of Bucks of the Province of Canada German being
in perfect health, thanks be given to God calling into
mind the mortality of my Body, and knowing that it is
appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain
this my last Will and Testament that is to say princ-
pally and first of all I give and recommend my soul
into the hand of Almighty God that gave it and my
body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent
Christian burial at the direction of my Executors
with-^{out} doubting but at the Resurrection I shall receive
the same again by the mighty Power of God. And as
touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased
God to bless me in this life I give, devise, and dispose
of the same in the following manner and Form.

First. I give and bequeath All and every thing to
Rebecca my dearly beloved Wife after my just and law-
ful debts are paid and also my landed during estate
during her life and in the event of her leaving us I give
by me I do hereby then give and bequeath All and every
thing and also ^{all} my real estate to Ann Neville, Elizabeth
and Susan children of Robert Upton to be either sold
and the monies to be equally divided, or else the property
to be equally divided, at their own discretion. And I do
hereby constitute, make and ordain Denys Thompson
and Robert Bourchier Executors of this my last Will
and Testament. And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke
and disannul all and every other former Testaments, Wills,
Legacies, Bequests and Executors by me in any wise before
made, willed and bequeathed ratifying and confirming
this and no other to be my last Will and Testament in
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal.
