All and Singular that Certain piece parcel or tract of Land Situate lying and being in the Township of Oxford (East) and being part of the North East Quarter of Lot number Nineteen in the First Concession of Oxford (East) aforesaid and which said piece parcel or Tract of Land is better and bounded as follows that is to say Commencing where a Post has been planted at the North East angle of the said Lot One hundred feet South from Dundas Street road then running parallel with the road now cut out between the said Lot and Lot number Eighteen South fifteen degrees forty minutes East forty chains more or less to where a post has been planted at the South East angle of the said piece or parcel of Land hereby intended to be Surrendered then North fifty three degrees forty eight minutes West eleven chains and thirty eight links more or less then North fifteen degrees forty minutes West thirty one chains and fifty three links more or less to where a post has been planted One hundred feet from Dundas Street road at the North West angle of the said piece or parcel of Land hereby intended to be Surrendered then North seventy eight degrees thirty minutes East Seven chains more or less to the place of beginning, and containing by admeasurement twenty five acres more or less.

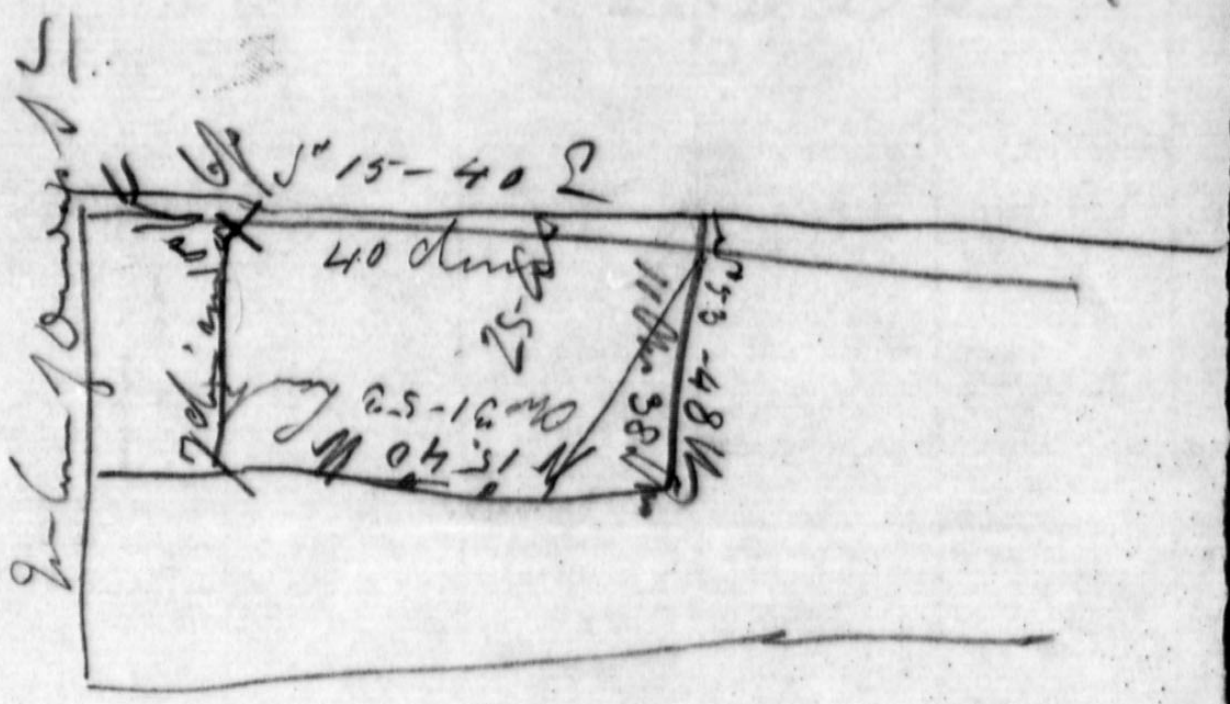

And also all and singular that other piece or parcel of
 Land situate and being in the Village of Woodstock
 in the said Township of Blandford being part of Lot
 number Nineteen in the first Concession of Blandford
 aforesaid / and on which said piece or parcel of Land
 has lately been erected and built a certain Messuage
 or Tenement now occupied by The Reverend William
 Wetbridge / and which said piece or parcel of Land is
 entirely enclosed and bounded with a close fence and
 may be otherwise known as follows Commencing at the
 distance of Six hundred feet from the South East angle of
 the Huron Road where it joins the Dundas Street Road
 in the said Village and also Commencing at the distance
 of One thousand three hundred and forty seven feet from
 the South West limit of the said Lot then North eleven
 degrees thirty minutes West one hundred and nine feet
 then North seventy eight degrees thirty minutes East one
 hundred and sixty four feet then South eleven degrees thirty
 minutes East one hundred and fourteen feet then South
 seventy eight degrees thirty minutes West along the North
 side of Dundas Street Road one hundred and ninety six
 feet more or less to the place of beginning and containing
 by admeasurement One Good and thirty perches more or
 less.
