The Petition of James Wolfe Whiting of  
Woodhouse in the District of London German  
Humbly Sheweth

That many years ago a Lot  
in the Town of Niagara in the District of Niagara was grant-  
ed by the Executive Government of the Province of Upper Canada  
to your Petitioner's Father Ebenezer Whiting late of Niagara a forsworn  
now of Woodhouse a forsworn German, but which Town Lot was  
thereafter erroneously described to another person.

That in answer to the Petition of the said  
Ebenezer Whiting praying indemnification for the loss of the said  
Lot, Your Excellency's predecessor in Council on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of  
April 1833 was graciously pleased to approve of the following re-  
commendation "That a special reservation of Two Hundred acres  
be granted Petitioner in lieu of the lot which was erroneously de-  
scribed to another?"

That the said Ebenezer Whiting has since  
authorized Your Petitioner to apply for the said Two Hundred  
acres of Land to be granted in the name of Your Petitioner as  
will fully appear by the accompanying Letter of Attorney and  
Assignment

That Lot Number 2 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Concession  
of West Oxford appears to have been many years since given  
out to one Hannah Brown but who has neglected up to this time  
both to improve the said Lot and to perfect her claim to the same.

That there is now no clearance or improve-  
ment whatever upon the said Lot.

Your Petitioner therefore Humbly Prays  
that your Excellency will be graciously pleased to cause a Notice  
to be inserted in the Upper Canada Gazette calling upon the  
said Hannah Brown or her representative to make good  
her claim to the said Lot within 3 Months hereafter, and  
if the said Hannah Brown shall fail to make good her  
claim

By a Minute in Council of the 24 April  
 1833 a special location of 200 acres of  
 land was ordered, the made by Henry  
 Whiting in consideration of his taking  
 out a lot in the town of Niagara  
 Lot No 2 in the second concession  
 Western Division of the Township of  
 Byford is located under title in Council  
 of the 4<sup>th</sup> April 1837 in the name of  
 Hannah Brown as the daughter of Peter  
 Brown late a Soldier in Sepate's corps  
 for which no description was given  
 On the 23<sup>rd</sup> of April last James Esquivel  
 Esquire applied for a location of the above  
 lot, but I do not find any order in  
 his favor
