either by Location or Lease.

Prays that your Excellency. will be pleased to  
grant. him permission, to Return on to said  
Lot. for the purpose of occupying it for the  
support of his large family.

Proper so to do your petitioner. as in duty  
bound. will ever pray. Henry Wiley
