Blenheim District of Brock December the 16th 1842
Sir I have been desirous for a long time to have my lands granted
for my services in the late war with the United States of America
at the time we volunteered in the flank Companies we were prom-
ised by General Brock if the Province remained vested in the Crown
for our faithful duty toward our beloved Sovereign we should have
300 Acres of the waste lands of the Province (each individual) when
the war was to an end and the Country saved from being over-
run by a powerful Enemy, our portion of lands was curtailed to
100 acres and he crowded into the uninhabited back woods, a place
where we were never called to repel the Enemy, but we had to stand
the open fields upon the lines to fight where many lost their
lives, Sir I am now in the 61st Year of my age and a cripple too
and in a state of indisposition unable to Labour much, I therefore
pray Her Majesties Government to grant to me 100 acres of the
North half of lot No 11 in the 12th Concession of Blenheim on which
at present there appears to be no individual Claim or the south
100 of lot No 12 in the same Concession, if vested in the Crown, the
Certificate obtained from William Gordon the then Adjutant and offic-
ing under which I served during the war and also Col. Robert Nichol
was presented in the Adjutants Generals Office, and I reciev^d
liberty to the Surveyors Generals to locate as the Records will shew
Now if Her Majesties Officers feel disposed to grant to me any of
the above lands if they are vested in the Crown. I so hereby
Authorise my trusty and beloved friend the Honourable Francis Hincks
M.P. to do and in my name to set to Reciev the Patent and forward
it to His Majesties Office. And Her Majesties dutiful servant
will ever PRAY

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Penhryn January the 27th 1843

Sir

I Reciev^d your letter dated the 15th of this present Month
saying that there are no more Locations of Lands under
the Provisions of the New Land Act, my Claim comes
under Orders in Council, and I am informed that I
must commute my Claim for such, which can be
applied in the Sale of Crown Lands, I am poor and
unable to purchase any Lands, I understand that the
Government will purchase my Land 100 Acres if so wish
you so good and send me the Money by Mail as soon
possible it will pay all my honest Debts for which I shall
feel thankful, Sir, if the pleasure of the Government is
such that I can Exchange my Land for Money you take
