you are the widow of the said John Young, and that the said John Young did not at his death leave any real or personal estate exceeding three hundred pounds and that the said John Young did not leave any children or issue living at his death.

Know all Men by these PRESENTS, that we Rachael Gyngg of the Township of Blenheim in the County of Oxford Widow of the late John Gyngg late of the Township of Blenheim in the said County, Cabinet Maker deceased John Proctor Master of the Township of Wilmet in the County of Waterloo Yeoman and Isaac Hlemms are held and firmly bound to Sir Edmund Walker Head of Council Governor General of the Province of Canada and Justice of the Court of Probate in and for that part of the Province of Canada formerly constituted Upper Canada and to his Successor and Successors in Office, in the sum of four hundred and twenty five Pounds of lawful money of the said Province, to be paid to our Sovereign Lady the Queen

his heirs or Successors; for which payment, to be well and truly made, we bind ourselves severally, our Heirs, and each of our Heirs, Executors, and Administrators, firmly by these Presents. Sealed with our Seals, and dated at Woodstock in the County of Oxford this twentieth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty five

THE CONDITION of this obligation is such, that if the within bounden Rachael

Gyngg Administratrix of all and singular the goods, chattels, and credits of John Gyngg deceased, do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels, and credits, of the said deceased, which have or shall come into the hands, possession, or knowledge of her or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for her and the same so made, do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the Surrogate Court of the County of Oxford on or before the first Monday in June next ensuing, and the same goods, chattels, and credits, and all other the goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased, at the time of his death, which at any time after shall come into the hands or possession of the said Rachael Gyngg or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for her do well and truly administer according to law, and further do make or cause to be made a true and just account of her said administration, at or before the first day of March 1856 and all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels, and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said Administratrix account, the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the Court for the time being, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons, respectively, as the said Judge by his decree or sentence, conformably to the provisions in a certain Act of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for the better settling Intestate Estates," and passed in the twenty-second and twenty-third year of the reign of Charles II, and also in a certain Act passed in the first year of King James II, contained, shall limit and appoint; and if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will or Testament was made by the deceased, and the Executor or Executors therein named do exhibit the same into the said Court, making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly, if the said Rachael Gyngg within bounden, being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said Letters of Administration (approbation of such Testament being first had and made) in the said Court, then this obligation to be void and of none effect, or else to remain in full force and virtue.

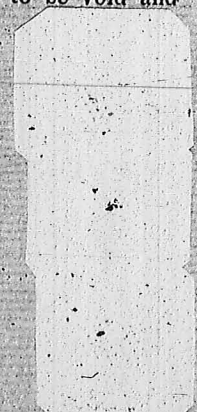
