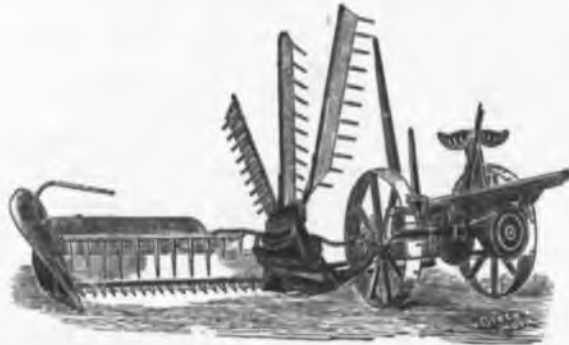

## COUNTY OF OXFORD.

This County is situated in the western Peninsula of Ontario, and is bounded on the north by the Counties of Perth and Waterloo; on the east by the Counties of Waterloo and Brant; on the south by the County of Norfolk; and on the west by the Counties of Middlesex and Elgin. It covers an area of over 700 square miles of as fertile and luxurious a tract of country as can probably anywhere be found in Ontario of the same size. Population last census, 48,247.

It began to be settled during the latter part of the last century; and, lying on the route between the eastern and western sections of the Province, it early became cleared and peopled by inhabitants who, by their sterling industry and perseverance, have reaped their reward in amassing in many instances a handsome competence for themselves and families.

The soil is principally composed of a clay loam, except the southern portion, which is more sandy and considerably hilly; but on the whole the County is well adapted for agricultural and especially dairy purposes,—the latter branch of farming husbandry being introduced into this County earlier than anywhere else in the Province, i.e., upon the factory system, which has reached such an importance now that it exports over 100,000 boxes of cheese annually to foreign markets, the revenue from which it may readily be conceived amounts to a very considerable sum. This branch of agriculture has done and is doing much for the benefit of the County as well as for its inhabitants, inasmuch as while they are receiving far higher returns as the products of their farms, the soil is every year becoming more rich under pasturage, being invigorated by its rest from cultivation. There are now about 150 cheese factories in active operation in the County, and all seem to be doing a good satisfactory business, which may be witnessed from the fact that every year there are new ones being erected and the exports are annually increasing.

The whole County has been well wooded, principally with beech and maple, except towards the south where there were great quantities of pine, until it has been gradually taken off and worked into lumber, of which there has been a large amount manufactured and shipped to different quarters.

The principal water privileges consist of the River Thames and its branches, the Otter Creek and the River Nith, which only runs through a part of the township of Blenheim. There are some very good mills on these streams, but the power they afford is not first-class, for in the summer season, especially when the weather is dry, the water becomes so low as to be of very little use.

The general manufacturing and commercial interests are well represented in its towns and villages; for although the County is inland, having no facilities for navigation whatever, it is well supplied with Railway accommodation, there being now the Great Western, the Buffalo and Lake Huron branch of the Grand Trunk, the Canada Southern and the Air-Line Railroads running through it, with a prospect of an early increase in the shape of the Credit Valley and the Woodstock and Port Dover Railroads, so that there are now competing lines both East and West and North and South, by means of which the wants of the County are carefully provided for.

Woodstock, the County Town, is situated on the Great Western Railway, about 50 miles west of Hamilton and 30 east of London, and is a very thriving town of about 4,700 inhabitants, in which there is now one large foundry in operation, and one under course of erection by Mr. Whitelaw, of the Oxford Foundry, Beachville, who is building a very large brick foundry in close proximity to the Great Western Railway Station, where he will employ in the neighborhood of 100 men. There are also several large grist mills, carriage factories, planing-mills, cabinet factories and a melodeon and organ factory. It is also a Port of Entry.

Ingersoll is situated 10 miles west of Woodstock, and numbers rather more inhabitants, and its manufactories are more extensive, there evidently being, if not so much real wealth,

at least more enterprise and ambition, which may be evidenced by the manner in which the Town has been and is being rebuilt after the fires with which it has been so lately visited; and we question whether any town of the same size in Ontario would, under similar circumstances, have recovered more quickly or successfully such great calamities. There has always been a sort of petty contention existing between Ingersoll and Woodstock. They both appear to be ever vying with each other for the precedence, which fact we may say is not as yet very definitely settled.

Tilsonburg was incorporated as a Town about two years ago, and although its location is very unfavorable (being built between two large hills) and its soil very sandy, it is surrounded by a very good arable tract of country; and owing to the fact that it has lately become a Station on the Air Line and Canada Southern Railways, it is now rapidly growing and increasing in importance, so that it now numbers nearly 2,000 inhabitants. There has been a very large lumbering trade done at this place, but of course it has ceased to be of such importance now that the pine has been pretty much used up; but the large saw-mills on the Otter Creek at one time did an immense business. It has a large planing-mill, two or three saw-mills, two grist-mills, sash and door factory, and two or three very fine carriage factories, as well as other manufacturing establishments, with new ones in course of erection.

There are several villages,—Emburo, Norwich, Otterville, Beachville, Princeton, Drumbo, Plattsville, Bright, and others of minor importance. There are saw-mills, grist-mills, &c., at all of the above named places; and at Plattsville and Beachville, a considerable trade is done in flax, there being large flax-mills at both these villages. This business in these places bids fair to yet become of considerable importance, as the people in the vicinity seem to be entering into it more extensively every year.

The Townships of East Zorra, Blandford and Blenheim, are especially well adapted for agricultural purposes, and it is questionable whether there is a more wealthy and thickly settled section of country anywhere in the western peninsula. The soil is of an exceedingly rich clay loam, and is well watered, being dotted over with numerous small spring water lakes.

In fact, the whole of the other Townships—West Zorra, East Nissouri, North, West and East Oxford, Dereham, and North and South Norwich, except it be South Norwich, and the southern portion of Dereham, which are (as before stated) somewhat sandy—are composed of excellent farming lands, and all are now under a first-class state of cultivation.

Of course there are numerous small villages we have omitted in this general description of the County, but which will be noticed in their turn.

The northern part of the County was principally settled by Scotch and Germans, who have become generally speaking very wealthy, especially the Germans in the Townships of Blandford and Blenheim, and they have brought these two townships into a state of cultivation equalled by few in the Province. The southern part is filled up by people of a more general nationality, who, although they have cultivated the country in a very workmanlike manner, have neither erected as good buildings, nor acquired as much wealth as their northern neighbors. This, however, may in part be owing to the fact that it was somewhat later in being opened up.

The religion is pretty generally diversified, there being a great many churches (and some very elegant ones) of almost every denomination. The majority however, are Church of England, Presbyterian and Methodist, although there are several Baptist and a few Roman Catholic and Quaker churches.

There are many other items we might notice with regard to this County which might be of interest to the public but we must forbear for lack of space, having endeavored as briefly as possible to give a general idea of the position, properties and characteristics of this County, which, although not as old as many others in the Province, can creditably compare with the most of them, either as to its material worth or agricultural prosperity, in proportion to its size and extent.

**INGERSOLL**—Situated on the River Thames, in the County of Oxford, and is built partly in the Township of West, and partly in the Township of North Oxford. The manufacturing interests, as at present developed, are probably the largest of any town of its size in Western Canada. There are two very large foundries. The largest, being lately erected by the Noxon Bros. Manufacturing Co., is connected with the G. W.R. by a switch, and is in close proximity to the station. This building is upwards of 500 feet in length and 200 in breadth. The company employ considerably over one hundred men, and this year will turn out over 1,000 machines, being principally reapers, mowers, and sawing machines. The other is owned by Messrs. Eastwood & Co., which, although not as large as Messrs. Noxon's, does a large amount of work, and employs over one hundred men. There are also four large steam grist-mills, and two very large sash and door factories, the one owned by A. Oliver & Co., and the other by John Christopher & Bros. There is more cheese exported from this place than any other town in Canada. The surrounding country being excellent for dairy purposes, and the people being early educated in this branch of farming husbandry, this trade has grown so rapidly that the amount of cheese now manufactured in the county of Oxford (all of which, with a great deal beside, is

shipped at this station) far exceeds that of any other county in Ontario. There are some very handsome churches, two banks (Merchants and the Niagara District), and some of the finest private residences in the County, more of which are being now erected, which shows the cultivated tastes of the inhabitants. In May, 1872, the town suffered very severely from fire, almost the whole or the greater portion at least of the business part of the place being destroyed. This for a time proved a very serious drawback to its prosperity, but still it only served to exhibit and call forth the latent energy of its citizens, for to-day there is scarcely a trace of the fire to be seen, and the Town presents a far more handsome and business-like appearance than ever before; and the shops on Thames Street can bear comparison with any west of Toronto. The streets are lighted with gas. The more recent fire of July last destroyed some very fine buildings, but even now the owners are busy rebuilding. We believe this is one of the chief stations on the G.W.R., four passenger trains each way stopping here every day. The Montreal and Dominion Telegraph Companies each have an office here. Distant from London, 19 miles; Hamilton, 60 miles; Port Burwell, 38 miles; Suspension Bridge, 100 miles; Toronto, 100 miles, and Detroit, 129 miles. Two mails each way, daily. Population, between 4,500 and 5,000.

facturing Company, established 1856, is very extensive, the building being 500 x 200 feet. The company employs over one hundred men in the manufacture principally of reapers, mowers and sawing machines.

*Ingersoll Foundry.*—This foundry was established in the year 1837, and is the oldest in the county. These works were started with small pretensions, but have from year to year been so extended that they now compare favorably with any similar works in the Province. Agricultural implements of all descriptions, engines, boilers, and tools are here manufactured, and the jobbing department is extensively patronized. Sales are not confined to the Province of Ontario, but articles manufactured by this firm are to be found in all parts of the Dominion. This establishment gives employment to over one hundred mechanics, and every facility in the shape of tools for the saving of labor is provided.

A. Oliver & Co., Riccarton Mills, established 1856, contractors and lumber dealers, manufacturers of doors, sash blinds and cheese boxes, with saw-mill attached, capacity, 10,000 feet per day. Shop 40 x 90, three storeys high; boiler and cheese box rooms, 20 x 90, two storeys high; saw-mill, 24 x 80, two storeys high; storehouse, 40 x 40, two storeys high; one engine, 20 horse-power; one engine, 35 horse-power; one boiler, 70 horse power; and gives work to sixty-five men on an average, summer and winter.

J. Christopher & Brothers, contractors, manufacturers of all kinds of building materials, doors, sash mouldings, cheese boxes, &c. This factory was established in 1850, and gives employment to one hundred men.

The Woollen Mills of Measra. Waterhouse & Bradbury are very extensive. The mills were established in 1865, and are situated on Queen Street, size of building 90 x 40 feet, four storeys high; employ fourteen hands, and manufacture about 48,000 yards of cloth per annum besides custom work.

Mr. Hector Campbell carries on a very extensive business in the pump line, turning out about 500 pumps in the year.

*Carriages.*—This branch of business is fully represented, among which we notice the works of Mr. George Bailey, situated on

King Street, corner Hall Street, established in 1854. Employment is given to thirty men, and everything in the carriage line is turned out in first-class style and workmanship.

McIntyre & Crotty, cabinet and chair manufacturers, established 1854, steam power, employ about thirty men. This firm do a very extensive business, and import immense assortments of cabinet-ware and chairs.

*Marble Works.*—Mr. W. M. Dwyer does a very extensive business in this line, employing a number of hands, and turns out first-class work.

House & Bevins, in the same line, do a very extensive business.

Petroleum has been discovered here, although not in paying quantities. When the oil business ceased, a well was driven for salt. It is now 1,700 feet deep. It is expected salt rock will be reached at a depth of 1,900 feet. The town contains a number of very fine stores, dry goods and grocery, shoe shops, harness shops, foundries and machine shops. Tailoring establishments, carriage factories, cabinet factories, grist-mills, saw-mills, sash and door factories, planing mills, a number of hotels, the principal being the Queen's, kept by D. Merrill; photographic gallery; a very fine school, in which there are four teachers; and a weekly newspaper, *The Observer*, published by W. S. Law, who has in connection a book and stationery store. Population, about 1800.

## MANUFACTURERS.

In this line we shall start with Mr. E. D. Tilson. First in order is the saw-mill, 80 x 85 feet; contains two large circular and one muley saw, edger and lath saw and shingle-mill; all driven by water, eighty horse power, and capable of cutting 8,000,000 feet lumber, and 3,000,000 shingles per annum, running ten hours per day. This mill gives employment to twenty men. Next is the planing mill, and sash and door factory. The building is 70 x 80 feet, two storeys high, contains two large planers, and all necessary machinery for manufacturing door, sash, blinds, &c.; driven by water; forty horse power; and gives employment to from ten to fifteen hands. Then comes the grist and flouring mill, 35 x 70 feet; four storeys high, three run of stones; three bolt and other machinery required for flouring and gristing of all description; driven by water; fifty horse power; capacity, 100 barrels per day; at present only three hands are employed in this mill. We believe it is Mr. Tilson's intention to increase this branch of his business. Next is the oatmeal-mill, 40 x 72 feet, four storeys high, for splitting peas and manufacturing oatmeal and cornmeal, all for shipping; the mill is driven by water power, and has three run of stones, capable of making 200 barrels per day. The above mill is not yet complete; expected to be running in November. Mr. Tilson has also a blacksmith's shop, which gives employment to two hands; a brickyard, employing six hands; and is largely engaged in building, employing eight carpenters, eight masons, three painters. Has a large farm of between two and three hundred acres; and is engaged in the mercantile business, hardware and groceries. The hardware branch alone amounting to about \$25,000 per annum. Mr. Tilson is also engaged in boring for salt. The well is now 1,700 feet deep; it is expected salt rock will

be reached at a depth of 1,900 feet.

*Tilsburg Iron Works.*—Carried on by A. H. Brown, [Bidwell Street, employs fifteen hands in the manufacture of ploughs stoves, saws, lath mills, &c.

*The Carriage and Waggon Works* of Robert Mills, situated on Broadway, employs six hands.

*The Novelty Carriage Works*, by E. Borland, situated on Broadway, main building 30 x 80 feet, employs from twelve to sixteen men, and turns out 100 conveyances per annum.

*Steam Cabinet Factory*, carried on by S. H. Palmer, situated on Broadway, employs four hands.

*Union Foundry*, by G. Darrow, established 1865, steam power, employs five men  
J. Van Norman, brick manufacturer, employs eight men, and manufactures 400,000 bricks per annum.

*Tilsburg Woollen-Mills.*—By Waterhouse Bros., situated at foot of Baldwin and Brock Streets, on Clear Creek, having first-class water power. This mill contains a full set of manufacturing machinery, also good machinery for custom work; employs from ten to twelve hands.

*Sash and Door Factory and Saw-Mill.*—Carried on by George Smith & Bro., and situated on Rolph Street. This firm are also very largely engaged in the manufacture of cheese boxes, and do a very large contracting business. They employ about twenty hands.

*Glasgow Mills, Flour and Grist.*—Carried on by John Hamilton; has two run of stones; capacity, 40 barrels per day.

**WOODSTOCK.**—The County Town and Judicial seat of the County of Oxford. Is pleasantly situated in a central location, in the south-west corner of the Township of Blandford, bordering on the River Thames and Cedar Creek, and is a Station on the Great Western Railway; distant from Hamilton, 48 miles; and from London, 29 miles. Population, 4,700. The town will be very much improved by the construction of the Credit Valley, and Port Dover and Lake Huron Railways; the latter having its head offices here. Woodstock has been always considered slow in its growth, but at the same time the progress has been substantial and sure. In the year 1854 the total assessment of the town amounted to \$41,293; this year it will exceed \$1,000,000; thus in twenty years it has doubled in value nearly five times. All this has been accomplished simply from force of business by the demands of the wealthy section in which it is located, rather than in the inherent energy or enterprise of the business men within. The receipts at the G. W. Station for the year 1873, for passenger, freight and general traffic, amounted to the sum of \$80,000, yet no place has suffered more of late for want of railway competition than Woodstock. Its grain and produce market was noted, for many years after the opening of the G. W. Railway, for its greatness, but on account of the large "through business" of that road, absorbing its almost entire capacity, accommodation has been withheld, consequently shippers could not give as high prices for grain as those places having competing lines, hence the market here has lost its once favored position. This may account, partly at least, for the liberality of the town in promoting, by such large bonuses, the construction of

more railways. The present population of the town is 4,700, and would now be very much larger if houses could have been obtained. Strangers living on their means admire it for its pleasant, clean and healthy appearance, and very many take up their abode here during the summer season. A large number also are attracted here on account of the superior educational privileges afforded by its schools, and more particularly the Canadian Literary Institute. No town of its size surpasses Woodstock in the magnificence and value of some of its retail stores, and none stand higher with wholesale men than do the merchants and business men of this place. In manufactures the town is well represented, in almost every department; descriptions of which will be found under the heading of manufactures.

## THE QUEEN AND THE ROYAL FAMILY.

Her Majesty ALEXANDRINA VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, born 24th May, 1819; succeeded to the throne 20th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV.; crowned 28th June, 1838; and married 10th February, 1840, to his late Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emmanuel, PRINCE CONSORT, DUKE OF SAXONY, PRINCE OF COBOURG AND GOTHA, who was born 26th August, 1819; died 14th December, 1861.
